Chair James Schlender called the meeting to order at 9:00 am.

Motion by Schleeter, 2nd by Peters, to approve the minutes of the October 29, 2020 meeting. Motion carried

Judge Yackel reported to the Committee. Heavy calendar of jury trials and visiting judges.

Clerk of Court Marge Kelsey provided a written report to the Committee. Juggling calendars with visiting judges.

Sheriff Doug Mrotek reported to the Committee. No injuries or lost hunters reported during 2020 deer hunting week. There was an increase in trespassing complaints.

Chief Deputy Joe Sajdera reported to the Committee. Purchased Rip and Run software from Spillman. Federal NextGen 9-1-1 grant submitted for funding to purchase backup equipment. Dispatch received 4,064 total calls with 1,473 calls for service in November. Road deputy staff at 100% with three additional part-time road deputies. Dispatch at 100% with 2 part-time employees.

Jail Administrator Jeff Johnson provided a jail report. November 2020 average daily population was 76.33. 74 inmates today and 5 out on electronic monitor. New phone system working well for inmates to access video, voice, texts, programs, and library of information.

Supervisor Van Etten asked about traffic fatalities. Sawyer County has had 11 traffic fatalities in 2020 and 12 heroin fatalities.

Animal Control Officer Sherrie Shelton provided a written report to the Committee.

Emergency Management Director Pat Sanchez provided a written report and attended the meeting virtually. Sanchez spending 75% of her time on COVID related activities.

Communication Specialist John Kruk provided a written report. Sheriff meeting weekly with Kruk.

Chair Schlender updated the Committee on Criminal Justice Coordinating Council. The LCO Tribal Council renewed the CJCC MOU and increased the contribution from \$25,000 to \$50,000 per year for 3 years. CJCC will begin discussion on joint jurisdiction and transfer of cases.

Ambulance Director Nate Dunston provided a written report to the Committee. Currently three open full-time positions being filled by Dunston and part time staff. Looking forward to statewide radio and paging system in the new year. Hospitals are full; transfers are down. Ten employees have been out YTD due to COVID exposure; three have tested positive. Total staff of 52

Sheriff's Department have had five employees test positive for COVID; all are recovered.

Fire protection discussion will be on January agenda.

JANUARY 2021 CHILD SUPPORT AGENCY REPORT

Based on November 2020 information-most current info available-

1256 open cases of which 709 are IV-D cases.

Cases with Orders: 89.14%

Paternity Establishment: 94.64%

Current Support Collection Rate: 67.12%

November Current Support Collected: \$167,382.40

Arrears Collection: 43.53%

Attached is the agency's referrals (cases) per worker.

Also attached is the Draft Resolution in Support of Increased County Child Support Funding. Requesting this Resolution be approved by committee and forwarded to county board for consideration.

Based on the number of current available jobs in the area, we have resumed referrals to the District Attorney for criminal non-support. To meet criteria for referral, payor needs to have the ability to pay, the knowledge of obligation to pay and failure to make payments for at least 120 days. We have also resumed requesting the court to execute Orders for Arrest in cases where the payor has failed to meet the purge conditions ordered by the court after being found in contempt of court, sentenced to jail and given purge conditions to purge their contemptuous conduct. If a payor is furnishing evidence of work search efforts, we continue to work with them and hold off on further enforcement. Employers listed on work search forms are contacted to verify the payor has actually made contact/completed a job application.

Genetic testing was provided on two cases in December.

Resolution in Support of Increased County Child Support Funding

- WHEREAS: SAWYER County Child Support Agency administers the Child Support Enforcement Program on behalf of the state, providing services to approximately 1200 families in Sawyer County residents including paternity establishment, obtaining child support and health insurance orders for children, and enforcing and modifying those orders; and
- WHEREAS: Our children's well-being, economic security and success in life are enhanced by parents who provide financial and emotional support; and
- WHEREAS: County child support agencies collected \$935 Million in child support during 2019 and established 98,405 health insurance orders for Wisconsin children; and
- WHEREAS: Sawyer County's Child Support Agency provides services to children as well as custodial and non-custodial parents that reduce childhood poverty rates, establish parental rights and promote the involvement of both parents in the lives of their children; and
- WHEREAS: The economic security and social service programs provided by Sawyer County Child Support Agency are needed by Wisconsin children and families now more than ever due to the economic downturn caused by COVID-19; and
- WHEREAS: State funding for county child support services has failed to keep up with county agency costs, which have steadily increased due to growing caseloads, inflation and new federal regulations; and
- WHEREAS: Wisconsin's Child Support Enforcement Program has fallen from 2nd in the nation for collecting current support to 5th; and
- WHEREAS: Wisconsin's decreased performance has led to the state losing out on an estimated \$70,000 in potential federal incentive payments between Calendar Year 2019 and 2020; and
- WHEREAS: An abrupt federal interpretation change in June 2019 eliminated \$4.2 million in federal birth cost recovery matching funds for Wisconsin; and
- WHEREAS: Wisconsin's strong performance in child support is at risk without additional state funding. Further drops in performance would result in additional reductions to federal funding for Wisconsin; and
- WHEREAS: Decreased federal funding results in less funding for Sawyer County's child support agency. This could lead to reductions in child support enforcement staff and services and reduced child support collections; and
- WHEREAS: New state investments in child support are amplified by a generous federal match. Every \$1 of state GPR invested in the Child Support Program generates roughly \$2 in federal matching funds; and

WHEREAS: Wisconsin's Child Support Enforcement Program is incredibly cost-effective, collecting an average of \$6.20 in support for every dollar invested in the program.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Sawyer County Board of Supervisors respectfully requests that state funding for county child support agencies be increased by \$4 million GPR in each fiscal year of the 2021-23 Wisconsin state budget, which will generate approximately \$7.7 million in additional federal funding each year. This investment will ensure that Wisconsin counties can continue to effectively provide economic support to our children.

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution be forwarded by the County Clerk to the Governor of the State of Wisconsin, State Senators and State Representatives representing Sawyer County, the Secretary of the Wisconsin Department of Administration, and the Wisconsin Counties Association for consideration.

- Total Calls for the Year of 2020 is 10998 Calls for service to Sawyer County Patrol Deputies.
- A long-time staff member in the Jail, Deputy Carter Hartling just recently graduated The Law Enforcement Academy at WITC in Rice Lake, and has just started his 10-week track in Patrol Field Training.
- Initial planning for the 2021 Slumberland American Birkebeiner Wednesday-Sunday, February 24-28, 2021 is underway and will be coordinated with the Birkebeiner Foundation, Bayfield County Sheriff's Office, Wisconsin State Patrol and other area law enforcement agencies. Due to the modified course, it is expected to have minimal impact to Sawyer County Public Safety resources.

Sawyer County Communications System Specialist – Jan 2021 PS Committee Report

Happy 2021 to everyone and I apologize as I am going to out at the Pipestone site with an ISP provider for Backhaul planning and work.

- 1.) **Programming and Testing** – A patch in between WISCOM (SWLAW1) and New Conventional (SWLAW-D*) is in place and deputies have started to test radio coverage over the past few weeks. Feedback has been very good and reflective of the coverage maps that are a result of the tower locations. An audio difference, regarding level, does exist as the two systems handle differently than the other. Once all law users are switched over the difference will not be noticeable at all. Part of this testing required console set-up and integration into the overall system. One of the biggest things is that the consoles will now be directly connected to the system/radios as compared to control base's such as the set-up was before.

As we continue with other law enforcement agencies new programming templates per department are needed. This means different channels for the individual departments as many have their own channel. In this programming we have been working hard on some standardization to make it more uniform. This would then allow a user from one department to pick up a radio of another departments and have a good understanding on how to use it.

The method of each user coming over one by one as compared to everyone switches at one time is good. This helps eliminate the issues of one person having an issue and everyone think it is an issue as compared to just one person. This also allows people to slowly become familiar with the switch and in a less forceful manner.

- 2.) **Training for New Radio System/Channels** - Training materials have been made for Sawyer County Law Enforcement deputies and Lt Johnson will be doing that group. This is in addition to other Law Enforcement agencies when they are ready to switch. The programming is being done around the time of training in order to make sure that everyone is trained and to eliminate as many questions or issues as possible.

Dispatch training was done approx. 2 weeks ago on the new console set-up and Cory will be looking at when to activate the new layout. EMS and Fire will be done after Law Enforcement is 100% cut over and the new paging is up and running. Cory and I will be working with each department at that time for direct one on one training.

- 3.) **IP Backhaul** – While the sites have been operating good some issues had recently arisen with the Moose Lake site. This was unexpected and had no means of origin from what Century Link had told IT and we had from the start of service. We have a different solution in place and will be awaiting till the spring time in order to put in a different solution.

The same holds true for Pipestone in where we are looking at using the microwave link from the site to the courthouse to help eliminate the need for a commercial backhaul solution. I have been in discussions with the State in how we can leverage more of our equipment that is being used with WISCOM also.

- 4.) **RF Interference Mitigation** – As of recent some RF (Radio Frequency interference has been detected on the SWJAIL base radio interface. This interference has been reduced but is still in existence. I contacted the console interface device manufacturer last week and have heard that they received my request. I hope to have a answer/solution soon and implement it ASAP.
- 5.) **Additional work** – During the course of programming I have found minor items that will need correction but none that take a priority or impact operation.
