Call to Order –Chair James Schlender called the meeting to order at 9:00 am. Roll Call taken. Quorum was met.

Certification of Compliance with the open meeting law was met.

Meeting Agenda

Public Comment

Minutes from Previous Meeting – A motion was made by Mr. Buckholtz to approve the minutes of the April 8, 2021, meeting as presented; second by Ed Schleeter. Motion carried without negative vote.

Circuit Court Report – Mr. Hoff advised that the construction of California Avenue is underway. On Friday, May 7th, the Courthouse Construction Ad Hoc Committee will meet to interview four candidates for the position of construction manager of the project.

Clerk of Court Report – A written report was provided.

District Attorney's Office Report

Child Support Department Report – A written report was provided to the Clerk at 9:09 am and will become part of the permanent record.

Sheriff's Department Report – A written report was provided. Chief Deputy Sajdera advised that the dispatch remodeling project is complete and work on the NG grant that the Communications Center received is near completion. The grant will cover 60% of the project costs for the Command Post portable 911 phone system.

Patrol Report – A written report was provided. Lt. Ripczinski mentioned that the call volume was down slightly since last month. Staff training projects are scheduled to begin soon in the areas of data communication, firearms and emergency vehicle operations.

A Communications Specialist written report was provided.

Jail Report – A written report was provided. Lt. Johnson advised that approximately one-third of the current jail population is waiting to be placed into a state prison facility. The daily average population now is 82.02 with a year-to-date average being 85. Deputy Sonya Sunderland has retired after 25 years of service; Deputy Hartling will replace her in that position.

Coroner's report – A written report was provided. In regard to the unsafe living conditions ordinance, the topic will move to the Health and Human Services Committee agenda.

Emergency Management Department Reports – A written report was provided. Ms. Sanchez advised that she has been asked by the State to assist with the National Patriot exercise which involves 30 different states and numerous counties in the month of June.

Criminal Justice Coordinating Council Update – Mr. Schlender reported on the activities of JusticePoint. The CJCC work group is currently working on a TAD grant for funds to create a diversion court and provide other diversion treatment options. Staff are now working with 95 pre-trial individuals to offer help for hearing attendance, employment guidance, and other services.

Ambulance Service Department report – A written report was provided. Mr. Dunston reported that the department has one paramedic and one EMT position posted. The billing company is working on old claims and payments are coming in. There are a series of staff training sessions occurring in the next couple of weeks.

Work on the NG911 grant for the mobile 911 answering system continues. We will be meeting with Mike Keefe in the near future regarding finance details.

Supervisor Sulley has been meeting with surrounding counties in regards to 911 outage which impacted much of northern WI on April 12, 2021. Many Surrounding Counties had a significant impact while we had minor.

Dispatcher Leif Mackey resigned his full-time position with the department effective 5/12/21. Leif served in the position for 6+ years and intends to remain part-time. The vacant full-time position was filled by Mathias Halbur. Mathias worked for the department as a part-time dispatcher and patrol deputy. We also hired another part-time dispatcher and are currently in the early stages of training.

Patrol Report- Attached.

- Patrol calls volume are holding steady for the past 3 time periods, Mar '21 was 792, Apr '21 with 755, while May'21 is 811. Although slight, it was a decrease of May '20, which was 812. With people returning to their seasonal homes from the winter months, there has been an uptick in reported property crimes. The Patrol has been working with the Detective in pursuing some promising leads in the cases to see if they're connected.
- Our deputies, in addition to our task force partners, have increased presence and traffic enforcement related activities. Specifically, Sawyer County Deputies in this period have issued 42 Citations for traffic offenses, 7 written warnings and 36 Non-Traffic Citation. To date there have been 88 Total Crashes, 19 with Personal Injury, and 0 Fatalities in our County.
- Grant applications are now open for the PATRICK LEAHY BULLETPROOF VEST PARTNERSHIP through the Office of Justice Programs, this is a reoccurring yearly grant process that refunds up to 50 percent of the cost of bulletproof vests for our officers. This year we have submitted an application for the amount of \$3106.00 in reimbursement.
- We have resume patrols into the Chequamegon-Nicolt National Forest areas under our cooperative agreement with the USDA, Forest Service. The current 2021 operation plan allows for \$2400.00 in officer reimbursement @ \$40/hr for patrol activity within the boundaries of the forest area between May and October of 2021.

Sawyer County Communications System Specialist – June 2021 PS Committee Report

- 1.) **Microwave Utilization** – After doing some extensive testing and with the help of Alex from IT we were able to determine the set-up of the microwave. This microwave has a link between the Sheriff's Department, WI State Patrol Radio Tower, and Pipestone site. Currently the connection of the Dispatch console and WISCOM radio connections reside on this microwave. However, when it was installed over a decade ago it was not documented on space, capacity, and IP addressing. Now that this was completed, we are planning on setting it up to route traffic between the sites and eliminate the backhaul from the ISP's.

When the project started the ISP-IP backhaul was solid and reliable for connection between the sites. Within the last year they have become unstable and have caused a great deal of issues due to the sporadic nature of operation. In this case, unless performance issues of the system were reported immediately, and a check of the system backhaul was able to be done immediately the performance report was inaccurate or incomplete. With this microwave we eliminate the issues at hand with backhaul and save money,

- 2.) **Jail repeater antenna system** – The antenna system for the jail repeater that was put into place years ago was ineffective and needed to be reviewed. This was brought to life with the Jail repeater going offline and needing to be sent in for repair. As the expansion of the radio system has started to take place the inefficiency of the antenna system came to light. Changes were made and then tested throughout the jail. An antenna study for the current jail and expansion into the courthouse with planning for the expansion will take place in the near future.
- 3.) **Jail repeater repair** – The jail repeater experienced some issues a couple of weeks ago and upon notification the back-up repeater went on-line. A loaner replacement repeater was obtained by me to be allowed to be used by the jail while the one is sent in for repair. It did take me approx. a week to locate a replacement as spare repeaters are readily available. The average cost of a repeater is approximately \$2,000 +/- and I personally ordered one as a loaner in the interim.
- 4.) **WISCOM 'AFF DENY' or 'DENIED'** – I was advised by Deputy # 340 that she was receiving the listed error message on her radio. She also noted that Deputy # 316 and # 356 had experienced the same issue. I am working with the state in order to determine what is causing these issues within the last week. It has also not been located to a specific region or area of the county. Thus, it appears that it is a WISCOM issue and not a specific issue to one unit or region/area of the county.
- 5.) **Additional work** – Update radios with new firmware, set-up programming of new radio, refurbish decommissioned radios for usage as back-ups or spares.
