Call to Order –Chair Ron Buckholtz called the meeting to order at 9:00 am. Roll Call taken. Quorum was met.

Certification of Compliance with the open meeting law was met.

Meeting Agenda

Public Comment – Steve Beining

Minutes from Previous Meeting – A motion was made by Mr. Peters to approve the minutes of the January 6, 2022, meeting; second by Mr. Van Etten. Motion carried without negative vote.

Circuit Court Report – Honorable Judge Yackel presented information on two bills that are currently going through Wisconsin Senate committees. He advised that Mendota is currently unable to process individuals deemed with mental health issues so these individuals are housed in jails longer than they should be.

Mr. Hoff presented an update on the courthouse remodel. Bonds will be issued in March with April close dates. Construction bids are due back by February 14th. He also provided a brief update on recent newspaper articles written about a potential LCO tribal Retrocession from Public Law 280 which governs who would have jurisdiction over tribal policing and court procedures.

Clerk of Court Report – A written report was provided.

District Attorney's Office Report

Sheriff's Department Report – Written reports were provided. Sheriff Mrotek mentioned that the jail population continues to increase and could be a concern in the future. Chief Sajdera advised that they have an opening for a full-time position but have a good number of applications to consider. The Lumen Command Post system is finally getting software and hardware access so they expect the process to be completed within grant requirements. Lt. Ripczinski reported that call volume is down from this point last year but did increase since last December. Fourteen crashes were reported with one fatality to date. Lt. Johnson advised that the County is currently sending inmates to Barron County due to our overcrowding in the jail. Ms. Shelton provided a written report for Animal Control and explained that revenues are not yet fully realized and should increase by the March 31st due date for dog licenses.

Child Support – A written report was provided.

Coroner's report --

Emergency Management/Ambulance Department Reports – A written report was provided. Mr. Dunston reported that they are busy with Birkie preparations, they have four open EMT positions to fill, and the ambulance billing service has been chosen with LifeQuest becoming the new biller. Local blood banks are reporting a need for blood donations.

Criminal Justice Coordinating Council Update – Mr. Hoff reported on the progress being made at CJCC Committee level; JusicePoint is hiring another staff member who will share time between the County and LCO. Diversion and pre-trial processes are continuing to improve and though the format of the new drug court hasn't yet been determined, there are several models to consider. Judge Yackel and Sheriff Mrotek reported on two success stories of local drug rehabilitation efforts.

Meeting Date/Time – The next meeting of the Public Safety Committee will be Thursday, March 3, at 9:00 am in the Assembly Room.

Sawyer County Communications Center

The Communications Center still has one full-time vacancy.

Newly hired part-time dispatcher Colleen Rogers has resigned her position in the dispatch center.

Currently in the process of training Amy Thompson. Amy currently works full-time in the Barron County dispatch center and is looking to assist us on a part-time basis.

On 02/17/22 we interviewed three applicants for the Communications Center. Currently in the selection / testing process and will set up shadows for the selected applicant(s).

We are still waiting the return of several of the Joint Powers Agreements that were sent to the municipalities. The municipalities include: LCO, Town of Ojibwa and the Town of Bass Lake (Washburn Co.) A second copy was recently sent.

The hardware and software for the Lumen Command Post (NG911 Grant) has arrived and is being installed this week. With the addition of this system the Communications Center will have a fully functional 3rd station and the new system can also be taken off site in the event of an emergency or evacuation of the Communications Center.

- Patrol calls volume remained steady from last month's report for Feb' 22 at 705, the three-month trend shows Nov '21 was 1022, Dec '21 with 699, while Jan'22 was 725. This month is also a slight decrease from Feb '21, which was 719 calls for service.
- For January 2022, Sawyer County Deputies in this period have issued 18 Citations for traffic offenses, 2 written warning and 10 Non-Traffic Citations. Per Community Maps there have been 18 Total Crashes, 6 with Personal Injury, and 0 Fatalities in our County for this time period (final numbers reported to DOT for previous months reflect differently from past P/S Reports due to various time and date range of the report).

Sawyer County Communications System Specialist – Mar 2022 PS Committee Report

- 1.) **Sawyer County Microwave** – Equipment has been delivered and now awaiting warmer weather. One box did arrive damaged, and it appeared that it held antenna equipment, but it did not, and it just arrived with the antenna delivery.

Now with the equipment in and staged at some of the locations we are await better weather days. I will be contacting climbers once again to see if we can get a better timeframe but weather, is the pain.

- 2.) **Preparing Agreements for Tower Sites** – A slight delay has occurred as some shelter costs might have changed and I am working to confirm that quickly (reason for delay of the agreement). I have also been trying to reach the Village of Winter President now to put her in touch with the county to have an agreement on that water tower. This is a key site to have coverage into Winter which is somewhat of a deep terrain for coverage.

As an education piece the very top of the Winter water tower is about (or slightly less) than that of the ground terrain a few miles to the east of the village of Winter along Hwy 70. This creates hardship for signals reaching the eastern side of the county.

- 3.) **Sawyer County Paging** – The discussion about paging coverage has come up again recently and some investigation has been done. It appears Sawyer County has three main areas or issues of concern of the users: 1.) They are using older pagers and the pagers have not had a check done on them in some very long time; 2.) The physical type of building that they are attempting to use the pagers (full metal buildings) or location in the building; and 3.) People are not using the pager at all and relying 100% on Active 911 than the RF signal.

The current system is three sites and once the microwave is complete it will be a total of six sites (City of Hayward, Hayward DPC, Meteor, Pipestone, Moose Lake, Loretta/Draper). This will help things as the sites will double, HOWEVER it will all be based on street level coverage. Coverage into a building for radio systems cannot be planned due to MANY variables. It should be the responsibility of the user or building owner to ensure that a signal can penetrate the structure.

The current system was checked, and all three sites are performing to spec for operation. I STRONGLY encourage departments to be proactive in the issues and work with me. Complaints are reactive and can usually be avoided.

- 4.) **Additional work** – 382 radio issues with the radio no longer working, 318 with a radio humming noise, ID reprogramming
