Patrol Report – A written report was provided. Chief Sajdera reported that the City of Hayward will be hosting the 2022 Northwoods Tech annual Law Enforcement Management conference in April at Flat Creek.

Communication Systems Specialist Report -

Jail Report – A jail report review provided by Lt. Johnson advising that numbers are increasing again and we are currently housing 16 in Barron County.

Animal Control Report –

Coroner's report – A written report was provided. Mr. Froemel advised that they do have decedents without family, thus the County is responsible for all after-death costs. He is working on an MOU with the Hayward Funeral Home for these purposes.

Emergency Management Department Reports – Written reports were provided. Mr. Dunston has been working with Jump River due to the ice storm and will now request approximately \$95,000 from the State. He is working on an emergency management plan for the airport. LifeQuest is still in the integration process.

Criminal Justice Coordinating Council Update – Lt. Johnson reported on JusticePoint working out of the jail to provide services.

Sawyer County Communications Center

The Communications Center is still short handed, the staff has been doing amazing covering shortfalls and have been working solo on many shifts filling others with overtime.

We have one applicant currently into her second week of training and another starting later this week.

Two more applicants are scheduled to shadow in the Dispatch Center in the next few weeks.

The third dispatch station is near completion with the exception of recording capabilities. We are waiting to receive a quote from Lumen (911 service provider) so the station can be connected to the recording software.

Hands free headsets were ordered for the dispatchers, this is a joint cost with EMS (Nate). The headsets should help with both hearing and voice on the radio and aid in alleviating some of our training shortfalls. Nearly all dispatch centers use headset.

- Patrol calls volume decreased from last month's report for April' 22 at **686**, the three-month trend shows Jan '22 with 725, Feb'22 was 705 while March' 22 was 815. This month is also a decrease from April '21, which was 755 calls for service.
- For April 2022, Sawyer County Deputies in this period have issued **30** Citations for traffic offenses, **0** written warning and **33** Non-Traffic Citations. Per Community Maps there have been **6** Total Crashes, **1** with Personal Injury, and **0** Fatalities in our County for this time period (final numbers reported to DOT for previous months reflect differently from past P/S Reports due to various time and date range of the report).

- We have received our BWC equipment for our Patrol and Jail, again our in house trainers will be working with the vendor to undergo training and deployment. In addition we will be pushing out our public notification piece and getting these cameras into the hands of our deputies as soon as we are able.

Sawyer County Communications System Specialist – May 2022 PS Committee Report

- 1.) **Sawyer County Microwave** – Company has submitted a quote and is awaiting to do the work as the work will take 5 to 7 days as the projected work timeframe. We are awaiting to final pieces which no one has control over except mother nature which is weather and road bans. We need dry/warm days for climbing and because of crane/equipment used we need to wait till the frost is gone for the road bans. The projected timeline is still this month.
- 2.) **Preparing & Agreements for Tower Sites** – the shelter for the Hayward Fire Tower Site has been built and we are waiting for Xcel energy to put in the electric feed. We needed to wait till the structure was on site and in place till the meter/service could be placed. Pictures of the site are attached.

Also, the agreement was changed for the Meteor site for the cost to use the site. At first in calculating the cost as being per foot of hardline to the tip of the antenna it has changed in our favor. It is now calculated as still per foot measured from the base of the tower to the tip of the antenna. This is better as the runs of coax from antenna down the tower to the shelter could be 20 to 30 ft MORE than the measurement from the tower base.

- 3.) **WISCOM 2.0** – The state is currently in an RFP status for bids on the 'NEW' WISCOM System which will be COMPLETELY 700/800 Mhz. This new system will NOT be in Sawyer Counties best interest and will create an enormous financial strain and even be LESS interoperable between surrounding agencies and counties.

The RFP looks to convert current WISCOM towers that are ALREADY in use from VHF to 700/800 Mhz but NOT add towers for local coverage. In addition, preliminary design is for mobile coverage but not for portable coverage which is one of the main issues now in Sawyer County. At current if Sawyer County was going to move to 700/800 Mhz it would require a move from the current 3 towers in the county to a minimum of 12 towers which is a 300% increase. Realistically it would need to be a move to 15 towers as three towers would be needed to cover the vast areas of Federal and State Forests. However, it has already been told that the National Forest will NOT allow towers to be put up in those areas.

It also is important to note that the additional 9 towers (for a total of 12) would require NEW tower sites to be built out and an approximate cost would be about \$1 million (or more) per tower site after land agreements, tower cost, building costs, tower climbers, and equipment for the tower. This also ONLY covers the infrastructure cost of the system it does not cover the subscriber/user radios as well as the dispatch console and interfaces.

With ALL surrounding counties being VHF Sawyer County would need to operate dual band radios. These radios allow the radio to operate on VHF & 700/800 Mhz frequencies to be able to talk to surrounding non-WISCOM counties. [We already have a lack or refusal of education on how users operate current radios]. The current cost of a mid-tier dual-band portable radio is

approx. \$5,000 - \$7,000 per radio and a mobile is approx. \$6,000 to \$10,000 per radio. These approx. prices are based upon make/model/feature which has a significant impact.

If we go by the listing of 945 ID's issued to Sawyer County for Law Enforcement, Fire, EMS, Hwy, PH, Sar, and Transit and say that 2/3 are portables we now have: 630 portables and 315 mobiles. Extend this price out at the approx. low side you have a total cost for the county being \$3,150,000 for portables and \$1,890,000 for mobiles for a grand total of \$5,040,000 for radios. Add this to the approx. \$9,000,000 for approx. tower costs the total for Sawyer County to go 700./800 Mhz would be \$14,040,000.

This also does NOT address the need for Sawyer County to keep up the infrastructure for Paging as well as interoperable gateways from VHF to WISCOM 2.0 for surrounding agencies to communicate directly with us. I also want to stress that this only give **95/95 MOBILE** coverage and is **NOT** for planned portable coverage.

4.) **Quick History of the new Sawyer County Radio System (NOT WISCOM)** – In recent some comments, talks, or discussion has been made about the current radio system going in place. I would like to clear those points up.

- The system is VHF and will be digital and analog capable for Law and being analog for all other users (Fire, EMS, PH, SAR, etc.)
- The project fully started in 2016 with planning and ordering of equipment this took awhile of planning due to things found with the previous system that was not being used (but in place) from the switch that took place in 2010 to WISCOM
- The non-WISCOM system will have a total of 7 sites: City of Hayward, Dairyland Tower (near B & K), Moose Lake Area, Meteor Area, Pipestone (center of county), Winter, and Loretta. [As of current WISCOM only has towers near Hayward, Meteor, and Pipestone]
- Coverage projected AND testing has been 95 to 97 mobile coverage and approx. 85 to 87% portable coverage [when a portable is placed AND used correctly].
- Sawyer County was held up by the State of Wisconsin frequency coordinator by almost 1 ½ years because they would not grant frequency authorization.
- Sawyer County was held up by the State of Wisconsin because the radio did not have CAP compliance (which in the end was not needed).
- When the CAP compliance was in process the manufacturer of the equipment delayed it by 3 ½ years
- We were held up by almost a year with a tower crew for Moose lake because tower crews could not travel due to COVID-19.

I strongly encourage education about this project by everyone instead of assumptions and misinformation. Education is key in this matter as well as how to use the system which many are not aware.

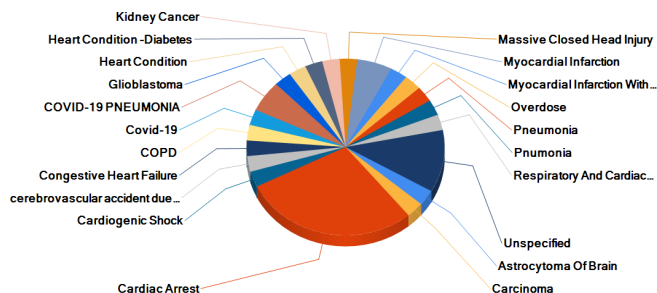
