Call to Order – Clerk Fitch called the meeting to order at 9:00 am; Roll Call taken. Quorum was met.

Certification of Compliance with the open meeting law was met.

Elections – Clerk Fitch called for nominations for the position of Committee Chair. Mr. Helwig nominated Ron Buckholtz for position of Chair; there being no other nominations, a call was made to cast a unanimous vote for Mr. Buckholtz. Motion carried without negative vote; Mr. Weaver was not yet present to vote. Chair Buckholtz took over the meeting at this time. Mr. Peters nominated Mr. Helwig for Vice Chair and there being no further nominations, a call was made to cast a unanimous vote for Mr. Helwig. Motion carried without negative vote.

Meeting Agenda

Public Comment –

Minutes from Previous Meeting – A motion was made by Mr. Helwig to approve the minutes of the April 6, 2022, meeting; second by Mr. Peters. Motion carried without negative vote.

Circuit Court Report –

Mr. Albarado provided an update on the courthouse remodel. The fence will go up and work will commence on May 16th. A ground-breaking ceremony will take place at 5:30 on May 19th prior to the regular County Board meeting.

Clerk of Court Report – A written report was provided.

District Attorney's Office Report

Sheriff's Department Report – Written reports were provided.

Communication Center Report - Chief Sajdera advised they are down two FT dispatchers, have two applicants in training and two more applicants scheduled for shadowing. They are purchasing hands-free headsets for dispatchers.

Patrol Report - Lt. Ripczinski advised that calls decreased slightly compared to last year. He congratulated Deputy Jordan Price in being promoted from dispatch to full-time patrol.

Communication Systems Specialist Report - Mr. Kruk said all equipment is now in and we are waiting to secure some tower climbers; they hope installation will happen by the end of the month. He provided a review of the various tower situations and once installed, every county department will be using radios on their own channel frequency.

Jail Report – Sheriff Mrotek reported on the vacancies in the jail and advised they are not receiving applicants for vacant positions.

Animal Control Report – The new AC officer will begin work on May 23rd with the position sharing time 25/25/50% of the time in Zoning, HHS and Animal Control, respectively.

Child Support Department Report – A written report was provided.

Coroner's report – A written report was provided.

Emergency Management Department Reports – A written report was provided. Mr. Dunston advised that the airport EMS training is taking place soon. The department is reviewing a HazMat grant application opportunity and the billing backlog has been completed, as invoices are going out.

Criminal Justice Coordinating Council Update – Mr. Albarado advised that the first of the opioid settlement payments may arrive in 3rd quarter this year.

Meeting Date/Time – The next meeting of the Public Safety Committee will be Thursday, April 7, at 9:00 am in the Assembly Room.

Sawyer County Communications Center

Currently down two fulltime dispatch staff. Many dispatchers are working over time and working alone. This creates higher stress levels answering 12 phone lines and monitoring all of the radio channels.

The first of our new hires is about $\frac{3}{4}$ of the way through her training. The second hire resigned after a few shifts due to the inability to hear and understand radio traffic. We have had two applicants shadow in the recent week and two more scheduled for this week.

There is no update on the recording set up for the 3rd dispatch station. Waiting on system quotes from the phone provider.

The hands free headset for the dispatchers have arrived but waiting on hardware to integrate with the radio consoles.

Discussions with Emergency Management Nate Dunston regarding Nixle emergency notification system and possible additional alternatives.

- Patrol calls volume increased from last month's report for May '22 at 817, the three-month trend shows Feb '22 with 705, March '22 was 815 while April '22 was 686. This month is about even from May '21, which was 811 calls for service.
- For May 2022, Sawyer County Deputies in this period have issued 22 Citations for traffic offenses, 0 written warning and 41 Non-Traffic Citations. Per Community Maps there have been 12 Total Crashes, 2 with Personal Injury, and 0 Fatalities in our County for this time period (final numbers reported to DOT for previous months reflect differently from past P/S Reports due to various time and date range of the report).

Sawyer County Communications System Specialist – June 2022 PS Committee Report

- 1.) **Sawyer County Microwave** – Update on sites done (as of this report writing):
 - Courthouse – Installed, awaiting alignment
 - Hayward Fire Tower – Installed, awaiting alignment and Xcel to run power
 - Pipestone – Awaiting install (planned the week of 5/31-6/3)
 - Moose Lake – Installed, awaiting alignment
 - Meteor – Installed, awaiting alignment (pictures of site before and after installation attached)
 - Winter Water Tower – delayed till tank top work is finished in approx. 60 days

Once the dishes are aligned, we can start to map and put traffic on the system. The plan is to bring the channels over one by one in the following order: Law, Paging, Fire/Common. It is important to remember that this is NOT going to be a flip of the switch. Some reprogramming, training, and check of user equipment WILL need to take place.

- 2.) **User Equipment/Training Concerns** – I want to once again stress the importance of old radio equipment that is being used on WISCOM and that is planned to be used on the new Sawyer County System. I hear people complain ALL the time about WISCOM coverage and other radio coverage. Many departments are running radios on WISCOM that are over 10 years; have bad batteries to the point the radio will power down when they try to talk; and have antennas which are not recommended to be used in a system such as WISCOM or the local system.

When these radios are put on the new system, they WILL suffer the fate of the current usage of the WISCOM system. Even though the new system has more towers and will not be digital for Fire, EMS, or other mutual aid channels it will still be impacted. Departments need to ensure that they are using updated equipment with correct antennas and proper batteries.

The 2nd part is training and WISCOM training was HORRIBLE to say the least. It consisted of a promotional video about WISCOM and did not cover the means of proper operation. When training was offered once again with radio drills in a table top fashion VERY FEW, if any, departments took advantage of it and blew it off with the guise of they know how to use a radio. The new system is NOT a P25 VHF Trunked Statewide radio network and will be a VHF simulcast system with digital for law enforcement and analog for other agencies.

Success in using the new radio system is going to be totally dependent on if departments have properly operational/functioning radio equipment, members that attend the training, and those members that actually want to learn how to properly use a radio.

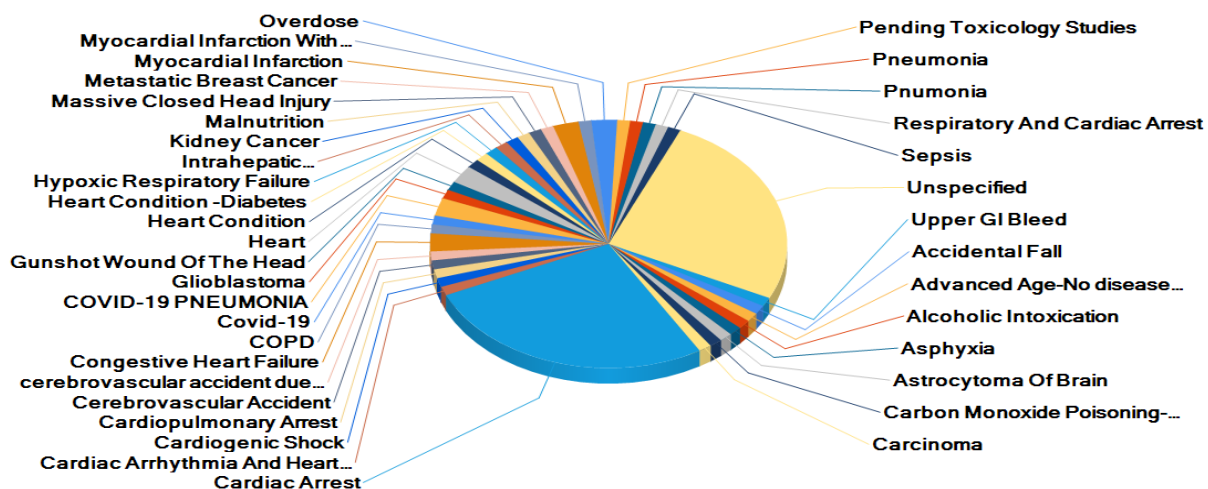
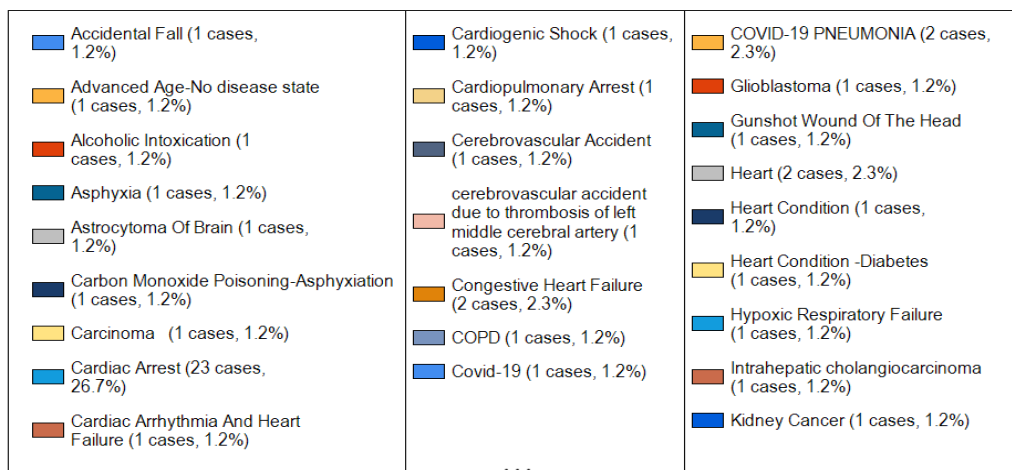

With much thought and input from my family, I have decided not to run for another term for Coroner. I do think that this is a good time to bring up switching from a Coroners system to a Medical Examiners system. The benefit of a Medical Examiners position is that it would be a hired, full or part-time position, more akin to a department head than an elected official. This would make running the daily operations of the position much easier having a scheduled person that can come in during the week to complete the paperwork part of the position.

I am willing to stay as long as needed until a decision can be made or replacement is found after my term is completed in January. I have learned a lot in this endeavor and look forward to the next phase of this office.
