Call to Order – Vice Chair Marc Helwig called the meeting to order at 9:00 am. Roll Call taken. Quorum was met.

Certification of Compliance with the open meeting law was met.

Meeting Agenda

Public Comment –Tish Keahna

Minutes from Previous Meeting – A motion was made by Mr. Savitski to approve the minutes of the December 1, 2022, meeting; second by Mr. Peters. Motion carried without negative vote.

Circuit Court Report – Courthouse Remodel Update – Mr. Albarado advised that the project is still tracking on schedule.

Clerk of Court Report – A written report was provided. Ms. Kelsey advised that the funds that have been collected for victims has reached \$70,000, and that amount was paid out to victims.

District Attorney's Office Report

Sheriff's Department Report – Written reports were provided. Sheriff Mrotek advised that he has sworn in all staff once he was sworn in on Tuesday, January 3rd. Chief Sajdera reported a very busy call week during the winter storm. They finalized a maintenance agreement for the 911 system with Lumen which will now renew annually, and are currently interviewing for two dispatch positions.

Patrol Report - Lt. Ripczinski also reported high call volume in the patrol report.

Jail Report - Mr. Woller reviewed the highlights of the jail report; a comparison with year ending 2021 was provided showing a slight increase in average daily population and female incarcerations.

Communication Systems Specialist Report -- A written communications specialist report was provided. Mr. Albarado presented the Communications Specialist Annual Contract for renewal. Mr. Kruk reviewed the current radio system and conversion plans. A motion was made by Mr. Peters; second by Mr. Savitski to approve the renewal. A roll call vote was taken and passed 5-0 with "yes" votes from Peters, Savitski, Helwig, Buckholtz and Weaver.

Code Enforcement Specialist – Mr. Blicharz reported a lot of calls on dogs left outside without shelter but upon further investigation, he found many do already have shelter available. A written report was provided. A rabies clinic is planned for 2023.

Emergency Management Department Reports – Appointment of Emergency Management Director Nicole Ripczinski – Mr. Albarado presented the appointment of Nicole Ripczinski as the Emergency Management Director. A motion was made by Mr. Buckholtz; second by Mr. Weaver to approve this appointment. A roll call vote was taken and passed 5-0; with “yes” votes from Weaver, Buckholtz, Helwig, Savitski and Peters. Internal postings are underway to replace Nicole’s current position in the court.

Child Support Department Report – Child Support MOU – Mr. Albarado advised that they are working on the document and discussions are still underway. This will return to the February agenda.

Emergency Services -- Ambulance Billing – A written report was provided. Mr. Froemel has a meeting scheduled with LifeQuest to review the process. They were able to provide oxygen to individuals without power during the winter storm.

Medical Examiner Report – A written report was provided.

Criminal Justice Coordinating Council Update – Mr. Albarado advised they are working on by-laws and have brought in additional attendees from public health. We are funded for the drug court and diversion court which should be functioning in February. Discussion on use of opioid funds is still underway.

Meeting Date/Time – The next meeting of the Public Safety Committee will be Thursday, February 2 at 9:00 am in the Assembly Room.

Sawyer County Communications Center

Two part-time staff members accepted full-time positions in the Communications Center. One of the new hires started her full-time duties on January 15th and the other will begin on January 29th.

Received notice from one of our fulltime dispatcher that they will be resigning their full time position effective in early February. With the two new hires this will leave two full-time vacancies in the Communication Center.

Currently have one individual in the early stages of the hiring process and one completing the shadow process.

The Center is moving forward with installation of headsets for use by the dispatchers. This will allow hands-free use when answering phones and responding to radio traffic.

Patrol Total CAD Calls Report- Attached.

- Patrol calls volume decreased from last month's report for Jan' 23 to **681**, the three-month trend shows Oct'22 was 724, Nov' 22 was 785 while Dec' 22 was 913. This month is also a decrease from Jan '22, which was 725 calls for service.
- For Jan 2023, Sawyer County Deputies in this period have issued **28** Citations for traffic offenses, **5** written warning and **25** Non-Traffic Citations. Per Community Maps there have been **12** Total Crashes, **4** with Personal Injury, and **0** Fatalities in our County for this time period.

- Total Patrol calls volume for 2022 was at **9,901**, a decrease from 2021, which was 11,138 and 11,050 for 2020. Some highlights, there 9% fewer traffic stops due to lack of grants and staffing, and 2% greater calls for 911 hang-ups. Total CAD calls received for 2022 are attached to this monthly report.
- We are proceeding with background checks on (4) four applicants for the vacant patrol position; which we hope to have filled by next month's report.

Sawyer County Communications System Specialist – February 2023 PS Committee Report

- 1.) **Coverage Testing** – Testing was done at the High School and Middle School for coverage of the radio system in the two schools. While the coverage is increased over the WISCOM System it is NOT 100%. To bring it to a level of >95% the need to install a BDA (Bi-Directional Amplifier). These devices take the signal from inside and push it out to the system and do the reversed from the towers. The devices do run a high price tag of approx. \$20,000 - \$30,000 plus any additional costs for antenna and coax cables per site. This is around the same cost as to install a channel in that area that is an addition to the system.
- 2.) **Clarification of System Design** – After the last public safety committee meeting and with some polling it appears that some misconceptions have occurred with what the LAW-D radio system will be (projected) to offer. I have bullet point the key parts of the system:
 - The System is designed for 95%/95% **MOBILE** coverage and NOT portable coverage.
 - Portable coverage IS increased over the WISCOM System but is **NOT** going to be 100%
 - **Mobile** radios put out 50 watts and have an antenna mounted on the top/roof of a vehicle.
 - **Portable** radios put out 5 watts which is 10 times less power than that of a mobile radio.
 - To increase portable coverage to an almost 95%/95% street level coverage would require a minimum of six (6) more towers per channel.
 - Portable coverage is directly impacted by the radio and antenna used (please see next section)
 - A map of the projected coverage is included in the final pages of this report.
 - ***The map does not reflect the additional site in the City of Hayward for added in city coverage and the plan for the Village of Winter.
- 3.) **Portable Usage on LAW-D** – In the above research I have seen a variety of portable usage which can have a significant impact on the transmission ability. Three main things impact the usage of a portable radio, and they are: 1.) Where they are worn on the officer/body; 2.) What type of antenna they are using on the radio; and 3.) The condition of the radio/state of the battery.



(This picture is used as reference) notice that the radio is on their vest or hip. When next to a body like this the signal from the radio can actually be blocked or be absorbed by the body. In addition,

having a jacket or covering the antenna can cause a degrade in signal. Planned usage would be holding the radio at head level and speaking into the portable.

In the following pictures you can see the size of antennas used that impact the range/performance of portable radio usage. Using smaller antennas, which some portables are using in the county, can have the range reduced. The portable in the middle with the approx. 7 in antenna is the standard one with the radio and is the basis for average portable design. The right picture is the hi gain antenna which would help increase coverage in hand usage or being used on the vest or the hip.

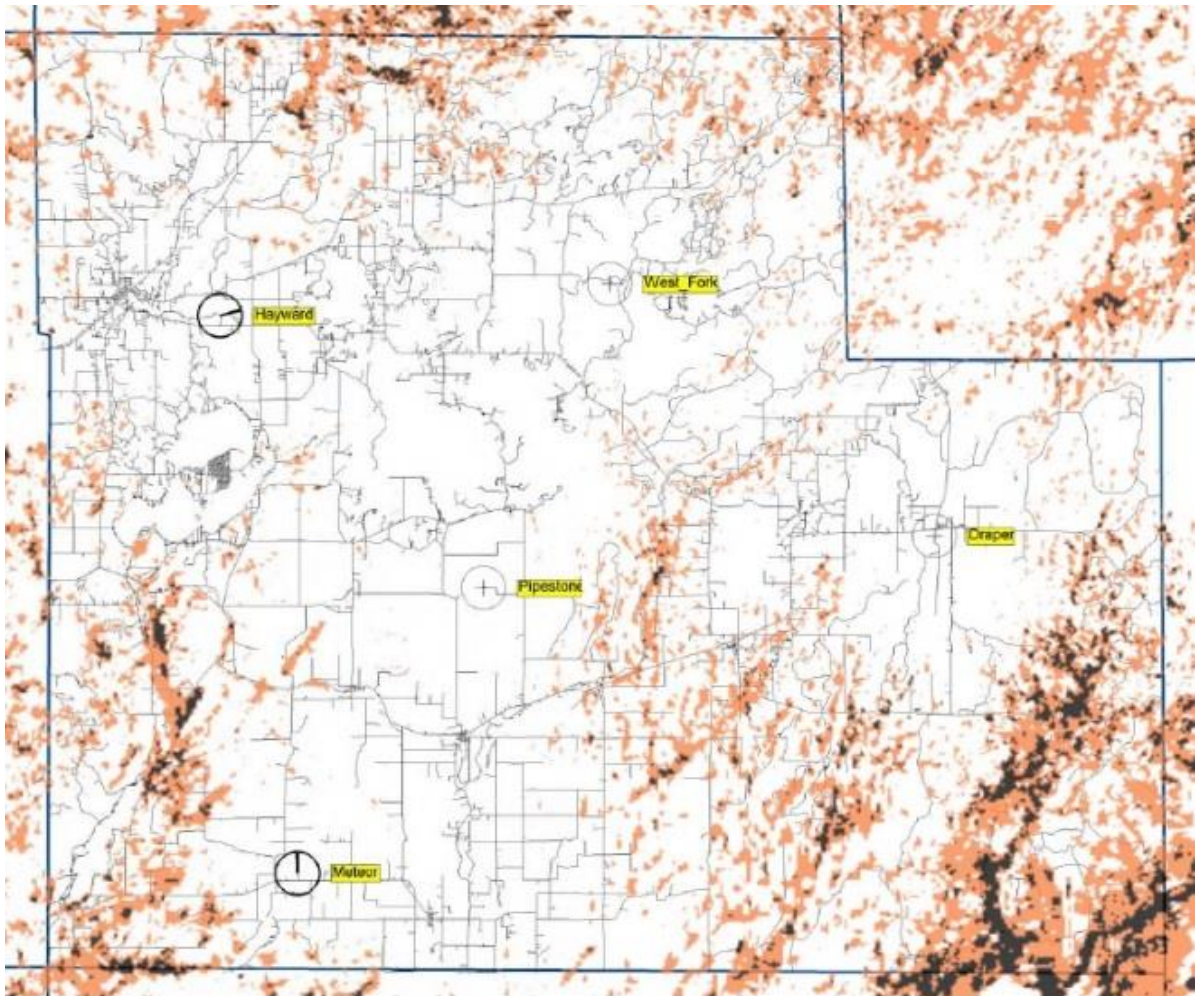

- 4.) **Winter Water Tower** – I was finally able to make contact with Lance from Winter Public Works. When it was asked about when Sawyer County could check the sites antenna and plan for installation I was advised: “Come to the next meeting, we are still going thru renovations on the tower. As of now it’s set to get paint touch up from the last paint job it’s had and also a complete rewire of the electrical system. There is only power in there now to power the circulator pump. There will need to be a lease agreement signed also for any equipment.” When asked about the next meeting I was advised, “Second Thurs of the month I believe it’s the 9th of February at 5:00, have whoever get put on the agenda.”

As you will see from the map the Winter Water Tower will help increase mobile coverage as well as portable coverage within the Village of Winter. The plan was to have the site online this past summer but the work on the tower took till the late fall. Once that was done you can see that it was still not fully completed and have not been able to do the work and bring the site online. It is also important to remember that the site was slated for the LAW-D channel and not Paging, Fire, or Common.
