Call to Order – Chair Ron Buckholtz called the meeting to order at 9:00 am. Roll Call taken. Quorum was met.

Certification of Compliance with the open meeting law was met.

Meeting Agenda

Public Comment –

Minutes from the previous meeting dated: February 2, 2023

Motion to approve made by: Mr. Helwig Second by: Mr. Weaver
Motion carried without negative vote.

Circuit Court --

Judge's Report – Mr. Buckholtz advised that he met with the Judge. When the new Judge is in place, we could expect to receive reports.

Courthouse Remodel Update – Mr. Buckholtz read a written update provided by Mr. Albarado. The new date of turnover date is March 31st due to unexpected delays. He provided a review of the potential additional expenses.

Clerk of Court's Office Reports -

A written report was provided.

Sheriff's Department Report --

Communication Center Report – Sheriff Mrotek advised that he has co-sponsored a Sheriff's snowmobile ride and had 11 Sheriffs join the ride, all with raving reviews on our trails and community. A written communications report was provided. Chief Sajdera reviewed the highlights; including the interview/hiring of staff. With the changes we are still two people short in dispatch.

Patrol Report – A written report was provided. Lt. Ripczinski reviewed the highlights of the report including call volume.

Jail Report – A written report was provided. Lt. Woller reviewed the highlights of the report including showing an average daily jail population of 71.2 inmates. Our total bookings were down in 2022 compared to the previous three years. Sheriff Mrotek mentioned that through research, they've found that 80% of inmates are unemployed and this addressing this issue will likely be key in reducing recidivism.

Communication Systems Specialist Report – A written report was provided. Mr. Kruk reviewed the highlights of the report on areas of coverage testing, clarification of system design, and portable usage on LAW-D. This outlines the reasons for gaps in radio coverage and provides options on what might be done to improve radio signal and trying to

improve portable coverage. Sheriff Mrotek advised they are trying devise plans to improve school communication coverage to 100%.

Code Enforcement – A written report was provided. Mr. Blicharz advised that he has been working with local businesses to get their permits to operate. The county will be having a vaccine clinic on March 24 in Winter and March 25 in Hayward.

Emergency Management --

Medical Examiner – A written report was provided. Ms. Ripczinski advised that she is closing out grants and continues to work on gathering storm damage data. She attended a statewide tabletop exercise for mass casualty/fatality event and is working with our Public Health Department to create additional plans for Sawyer.

Child Support Department Report --

A written report was provided.

Child Support MOU – No update; this item will return in March.

Emergency Services --

Ambulance Report – Mr. Froemel reviewed the ambulance billing report provided. At gross revenue, the agency is at 28% recovery; Mr. Froemel is planning to compare these results with the previous company. They remain short-staffed which also affects the number of transfers they can accept. He has been able to add some staff. He is attempting to recruit some nurses to accept transfers, as well. Sawyer is one of the most requested training sites in the region. Mr. Froemel is also now able to perform as a training officer in most medical areas.

Ambulance Transfer Runs Update --

Ambulance Billing – A written report was provided.

Medical Examiner Report – Mr. Froemel advised that we are seeing another increase in overdose cases with meth and fentanyl mixture.

Criminal Justice Coordinating Council Update -

Mr. Buckholtz read a report provided by Mr. Albarado. The treatment court will be functional soon.

Meeting Date/Time – The next meeting of the Public Safety Committee will be Thursday, March 2 at 9:00 am in the Assembly Room.

Meeting adjourned at 9:57 am.

Public Safety Committee
March 2, 2023

- With the hiring of two new fulltime employees, we have now lost two fulltime employees both taking with them 10 years experience. We have four vacant fulltime shifts at this time.
- Currently are training in one part-time dispatcher who will most likely be seeking fulltime employment in the future.
- We are receiving applications for dispatchers; four applicants have scheduled, and some have had, their shadow with dispatch and are eager to continue on in the process.
- Looking at utilizing Criticall – a program for training and evaluating new dispatchers. Douglas County has been utilizing this program for 4-5 years, resulting in less turnover and higher completion rates during training.
- The fulltime staff along with fulltime patrol deputies, have been putting in a lot of hours and several days in a row, we would not be able to keep our community safe without them.

- Patrol calls volume decreased from last month's report for Feb' 23 to **633**, the three-month trend shows Nov' 22 was 785, Dec' 22 was 913, while Jan' 23 was 681. This month is also a decrease from Feb' 22, which was 705 calls for service.
- For Feb 2023, Sawyer County Deputies in this period have issued **36** Citations for traffic offenses, **3** written warning and **20** Non-Traffic Citations. Per Community Maps there have been **9** Total Crashes, **2** with Personal Injury, and **0** Fatalities in our County for this time period.

SAWYER COUNTY ANIMAL CONTROL AND CODE ENFORCEMENT REPORT

Animal Control

- Uptick in At-Large complaints.
- 1 Vicious Dog Declaration stemming from the dog quarantined in our facility at the end of January.
- Rabies Vaccine Clinic dates, times, and pricing have been finalized.
 - o March 24th, 2023 at the Village of Winter Fire Hall from 12 PM to 6 PM.
 - o March 25th, 2023 at the City of Hayward Fire Hall from 9 AM to 2 PM.
 - o Rabies shots will be \$15 per shot, Microchips will be \$18 per chip.
 - Profit will be split between County and Leading Edge Vet.
 - The cost of each rabies shot is \$3.87 a dose, meaning the county will receive \$5.56 per rabies shot.
 - The cost of each chip is \$9.39, meaning the county will receive \$4.30 per chip.
 - License Tags will also be sold at the clinics, altered tags for \$10 and non-altered for \$15.
 - o We will be getting volunteers for the clinics, along with attendance from the County Humane Officer.
- Revenue for the month of January was up significantly from last year.
 - o \$7540 for January 2023, compared to \$5662.75 from 2022. 28% rise.
- Social Media Presence has also seen a rise in engagement and “likes”.
 - o Facebook is a great tool, especially for getting dogs home once we pick them up.
 - o Growing the animal control page is a constant goal.
 - Leads to more eyes on posts about found strays, licensing information, learning and enrichment opportunities, and overall revenue potential.

Code Enforcement

- New citation books were printed and received from Advance Printing as a solution to the state no longer producing them.

Sawyer County Criminal Justice Coordinating Council (CJCC) Bylaws

Article I: Name and Creation

The name of this council shall be the Sawyer County Criminal Justice Coordinating Council. It will be referred to as the "CJCC" throughout these Bylaws. The CJCC was created as part of a state-wide initiative to further the Mission set forth below. The CJCC is recognized by the Sawyer County (the "County") Board of Supervisors as an ad hoc committee of the County Board of Supervisors.

Article II: Bylaws

The CJCC has authority to adopt these Bylaws. These Bylaws have been reviewed, approved and adopted both the CJCC and the County Board of Supervisors.

Article III: Vision and Mission

VISION: Utilizing evidence-based practices making the criminal justice system a better investment toward improving the quality of life in Sawyer County.

MISSION: To promote implementation of effective criminal justice policies and practices maximizing justice and public safety

Article IV: Duties and Powers

1. The CJCC is created to act in an advisory capacity to both constitutionally elected officers and committees of the County Board of Supervisors which oversee programs and services related to criminal justice. The CJCC shall recommend to appropriate parties or committees actions including the creation, elimination or modification of programs, policies and procedures including the evaluation of the Sawyer County Criminal Justice Programs in accordance with the Sawyer County Criminal Justice Vision and Mission.
2. The CJCC shall help ensure coordinated efforts. Proposed policy changes relating to criminal justice may be brought to the CJCC for review and for recommendations to the appropriate committees or entity.
3. The CJCC may assist the County in setting priorities for the Sawyer County Criminal Justice System.
4. The CJCC shall assist in sharing the responsibility as it relates to new programs. It is understood that new directions and programming may involve some unforeseen consequences. It is the CJCC's responsibility as a whole to support its recommendations.
5. The CJCC may perform such other general functions necessary to implement its responsibilities, as directed by the County Board.

6. The CJCC may designate necessary subcommittees or workgroups to accomplish their work as well as be assigned responsibility for oversight of programs in absence of an existing oversight committee.
7. Notwithstanding any provision in these Bylaws, the CJCC shall be subject to and conduct itself according to the County Board of Supervisors' Policy and Procedure Manual, as may be amended.
8. The CJCC shall be subject to all State of Wisconsin Statutes, codes, Executive Orders and other applicable laws and regulations.

Article V: Structure

Section A: Membership.

The CJCC shall consist of sixteen(16) members (the "Members"). The CJCC shall have fifteen (15) voting members (the "Voting Members"), and the Chair shall be a non-voting member, as described in Article VI below. All the positions listed below, unless the position is elected Chair as described in Article VI below, shall be permanent Voting Members of this CJCC:

- a. Sawyer County Circuit Court Judge
- b. Sawyer County Sheriff or designee
- c. Sawyer County District Attorney or designee
- d. Sawyer County Jail Administrator or designee
- e. Sawyer County Administrator
- f. Two (2) tribal government representatives
- g. State Public Defender Office representative
- h. Wisconsin Department of Corrections representative
- i. Two (2) Sawyer County Board of Supervisor
- j. Two (2) residents of Sawyer County
- k. LCO Tribal Judge
- l. Sawyer County Health and Human Services representative (staff)
- m. State of Wisconsin Public Defenders office representative

Section B: Adding Positions.

1. The CJCC may recommend to the County Board of Supervisors that additional positions be added to the CJCC, as the CJCC deems appropriate.
2. Adding positions to the CJCC will require an amendment to the Bylaws Article V, Section A: Membership. Adding a CJCC position requires a 3/4 majority of the appointed number of Voting Members and confirmation by the County Board of Supervisors.
3. If the newly-created position requires an election by the CJCC, then the CJCC will conduct an election to fill the position at the next regularly-scheduled CJCC meeting after the position is created. A CJCC appointment requires a majority vote of the Voting

Members and confirmation by the County Board of Supervisors.

4. If the newly-created position requires an appointment by a department or organization, the Chair shall contact the department/organization and ask that a representative be appointed. All additional positions to the CJCC shall require confirmation by the County Board of Supervisors.

Section C: Removal.

1. Any CJCC Member may be removed by the County Board of Supervisors, with or without cause, after a recommendation by the CJCC and a 2/3 a majority vote of the Voting Members.
2. Removal of a CJCC Member can be placed upon the agenda under CJCC New Business by the Chair or by a written petition from another Member submitted to the Chair.
3. If a Member is removed, the Chair shall contact the department/organization the removed Member represented and ask that another representative be appointed.
4. If the removed Member held a CJCC-elected position, the CJCC shall hold an election to fill the position at the next regularly-scheduled CJCC meeting after the Member is removed. Appointment of the new Member upon removal of another Member requires a majority vote of the Voting Members and shall be confirmed by the County Board of Supervisors.
5. A Member is eligible for removal from the CJCC due to nonparticipation after missing three (3) meetings, without sufficient cause, in a calendar year. Sufficient cause is to be determined by the Chair. Removal of a Member for nonparticipation requires a majority vote of the Voting Members and confirmation by the County Board of Supervisors.
6. A position on the CJCC may be removed only through an amendment to the Bylaws Article V, Section A: Membership. Removal of a CJCC position requires a 3/4 majority of the appointed number of Voting Members and shall be confirmed by the County Board of Supervisors.

Section D: Authority of the CJCC. The CJCC has no legal authority to order changes to Sawyer County's Criminal Justice System, but it may bring about changes through consensus by the participating departments, agencies and the County Board of Supervisors. The CJCC reviews policies and programs within the criminal justice system and makes final recommendations to all justice system partners.

Section E: Meetings.

1. Meetings of the CJCC shall be set by the CJCC at the end of their session for the following month. Notice of CJCC meeting times and locations shall be provided to all Members and duly posted in compliance with open meeting statutes.
2. Minutes of the CJCC meetings shall be documented and distributed to all Members of the CJCC. Minutes will also be posted in compliance with open meeting statutes. The CJCC Chairperson shall designate someone to take minutes for all CJCC meetings.
3. Recommendations of the CJCC will be made by a majority rule vote of Voting Members.

Section G: Quorum. A quorum must be complied with at all CJCC meetings. A quorum requires a 51% majority of Voting Members to be in attendance.

Article VI: Officers

1. The officers of the CJCC shall be a Chair and Vice-Chair. The CJCC shall elect officers biennially at the May meeting of even-numbered years. Such officers shall take office upon election. If an officer resigns or is removed, a replacement officer shall be elected by the CJCC at the next regularly-scheduled CJCC meeting.
2. The Chair shall be responsible for filing End-of Year Reports with the County Clerk. The Vice-Chair shall file an End of the Year Report with the Chair.
3. It shall be the responsibility of the Chair and Vice-Chair, in coordination with the County Administrator to:
 - a. Develop and cause to be published CJCC Agendas.
 - b. Prepare materials for CJCC Members in preparation for scheduled CJCC meetings. Materials may be emailed to Members when appropriate.
 - c. Any other actions that the Chair deems necessary for the efficient functioning of the CJCC.
4. The CJCC Chair is a quasi-nonvoting member of the CJCC and subject to the following:
 - a. The Chair can only vote in order to break a tie.
 - b. The Vice-Chair retains their Voting Member status on the CJCC. If the Vice-Chair acts as the Chair in the Chair's absence, (s)he may not vote for that meeting unless it is to break a tie.
5. The Chair shall preside at all CJCC meetings. The Vice-Chair shall preside in the absence of the Chair.

Article VII: Change in Bylaws

1. Any Voting Member may propose an amendment to the Bylaws. Proposed amendments to the Bylaws are to be included on the agenda of a CJCC meeting, any action taken on the proposed amendments must be made at a subsequent meeting of the CJCC and will require a minimum 2/3 majority vote of the appointed number of Voting Members.
2. Any amendment to the Bylaws shall be confirmed by the County Board of Supervisors.
