Call to Order – Chair Ron Buckholtz called the meeting to order at 9:00 am. Roll Call taken. Quorum was met.

Certification of Compliance with the open meeting law was met.

Meeting Agenda

Public Comment –

Minutes from the previous meeting dated: July 6, 2023

Circuit Court --

Judge's Report –

Courthouse Remodel Update – Mr. Albarado advised that the remodeled courtroom is nearly finished; the staff and new judge will be able to move into their quarters on Monday. August 13th the room will be turned over.

Clerk of Court's Office Reports -

A written report was provided. The July jury trial was cancelled but there are ten scheduled for August. Revenue collected through the SDC and TRIP/DOR sites is \$13,994.03. Wage income assignment receipted \$246.91. Ms. Kelsey reported that the office has taken on the duty of Probate and is working with a retired Register of Probate for transition assistance. They will need to replace one staff member who is leaving.

Sheriff's Department Report –

Communication Center Report – Ms. Ripczinski provided an overview. There are three full-time positions open in dispatch; applications are coming in. Communication with the Sawyer County Ambulance Service regarding Edgewater Township are continuing and efforts are being made to provide the most reliable and effective response as possible. As of 6/28/23, there have been 10,410 total calls in dispatch. New dispatch headsets have arrived and will be installed soon.

Patrol Report – A written report was provided identifying total CAD calls and the breakout of calls by nature of call. A breakout of calls by month/nature was also included. Lt. Ripczinski advised there have been a total of 30 crashes with four fatalities to date this year.

Jail Report – A written report was provided. The average daily population total for July was 83.41 with 1 individual on Huber privileges. The inmate unemployment rate is 82.6%. Chief Sajdera advised that female inmates have returned to the Sawyer County Jail last week.

Communication Systems Specialist Report – Mr. Kruk provided an update of system progress. Equipment damaged during the lightning strike has been delivered and one additional receiver site at the Loretta/Draper area has been turned on. They are still awaiting equipment to interface into the computer counsel and will begin testing these systems next week. He provided an update of equipment and plans for the Loretta/Draper area; he had a meeting with the Town of Draper Fire Chief and Municipal Clerk to discuss.

Town of Draper Emergency Services Communications Issues – An email from the Town of Draper and a Resolution #12-2023 Resolve Emergency Communications Issues were presented for review. This item will return on the September agenda.

Code Enforcement Specialist – A written report was provided identifying calls received, revenue collected and shelter occupancy rates. In June there were 21 dogs admitted to the pound and \$980 revenue collected.

Emergency Management --

A written report was provided. The Winter School active shooter event will be held August 22nd, and a HazMat full scale exercise is scheduled for the end of October-November.

Child Support Department Report --

A written report was provided identifying 1,132 open cases and total June support due at \$1,121,602.59; total June support collected was \$802, 408.84.

Emergency Services --

Ambulance Report and Ambulance Billing – A written report was provided and reviewed by Mr. Froemel. The July run total to-date is 1,158 compared to 1,089 in 2022. Crews rendered aid to 33 emergency calls over the 4-day July 4th weekend. Coverage over the Musky Fest and LWC went smoothly and without incident. A Calls by Towns and chart of calls were also provided. They now have a method to track Narcan use and will provide a report sometime in the future. The department is almost at full staff and community CPR training has been conducted. Hayward High School is starting an EMR class this year. Mr. Albarado reviewed the highlights of the ambulance billing report; the same report that goes to Finance Committee each month.

Town Ambulance Contract Update – Mr. Albarado advised that they have visited with the town of Birchwood and Bass Lake; no decisions have been made yet. They will meet with the town of Stone Lake next week.

Criminal Justice Coordinating Council Update -

Review/Approve Draft Budget for Use of Funds – Joyce Knowlton reported that Sawyer County is second in the State 2nd to Milwaukee) for overdose deaths. The cooperative team that has been formed has been meeting and trying to educate the community on steps to reduce this statistic. More than 200 people have taken Narcan training since the end of May. Newspaper interviews are in process; they have goals to meet with youth clubs. Julia Lyons provided a 2023 Substance Misuse proposed budget using Opioid Settlement and grant funds, totaling \$169,552 with funds yet to be received in 2023/2024. They are also developing a website and will be able to receive donations through their program. A motion was made to approve this proposed budget use for opioid settlement funds and move it through committees by Mr. Helwig; second by Mr. Savitski. A voice vote was taken and passed 4-1; with “nay” vote from Mr. Weaver.

Meeting Date/Time – The next meeting of the Public Safety Committee will be Thursday, September 7th at 9:00 am in the Board Room.

- Patrol call volume decreased from last month's report for August' 23 to **921**, the three-month trend shows: June' 23 was 1281, while July' 23 was 1041. This month was also an increase from Aug' 22, which was 703 calls for service.
- For Aug 2023, Sawyer County Deputies in this period have issued **37** Citations for traffic offenses, **4** written warning and **5** Non-Traffic Citations. Per Community Maps: there have been **17** Total Crashes, **10** with Personal Injury, and **0** Fatalities in our County for this time period.

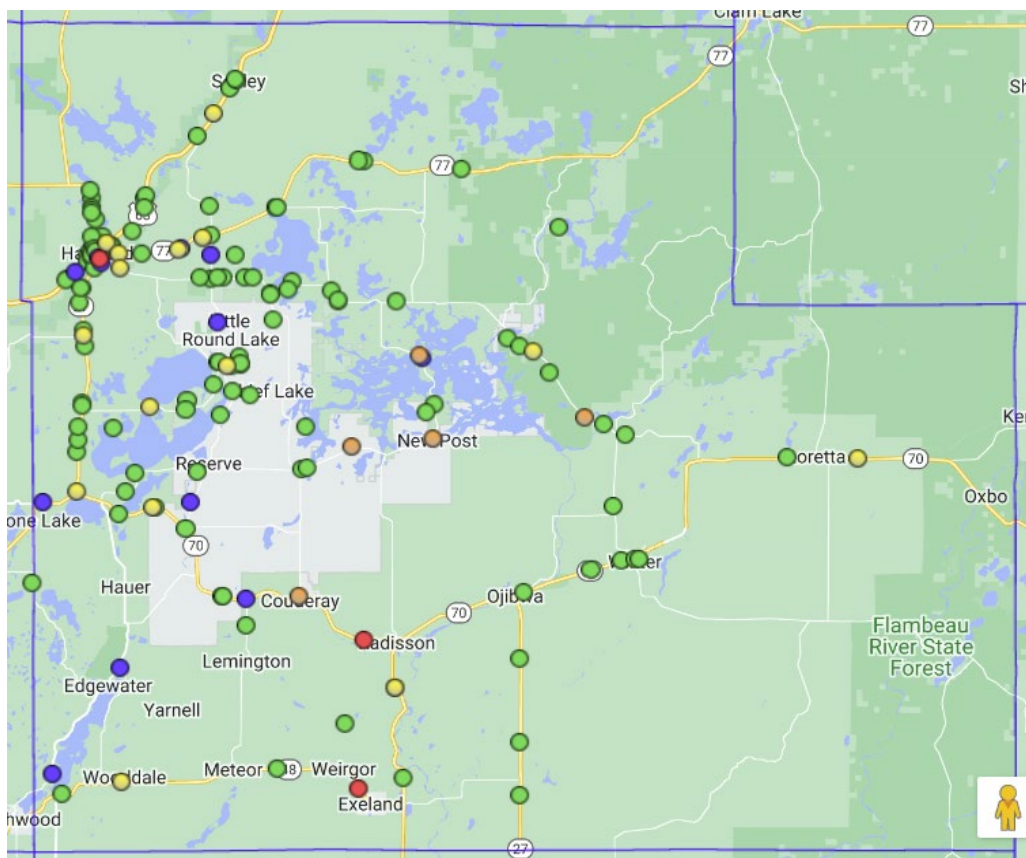

Subject: Active 911 apps and pagers not working

Hi Corey,

Draper Fire department is not getting any pages whatsoever on the Active 911 apps and also not getting some pages on our physical pagers, regardless of their location.

Currently we have the following people in the system with apps on their phones, the apps do not receive any pages:

Tim Kelley, Steve Beining, Liz Klein, Chris Klein, Jeff Heath.

(Also an ex-member Paul Zmuda is still listed and should be removed.)

We can see each other's names in the apps so we are at least partly registered with the service. It is also odd that each person's name is listed twice.

We got your advice regarding Steve and Jeff's apps and will follow that up on our end. Not sure why we did not get Active911 pages when we did the three test pages last week. We will try again- do we need to specify the app for the test, or is it automatically paged the same as the pagers?

We would like to get paged by all possible means since the pager system is not reliable here. For example, a text message or email with the page/address would be helpful for most if not all of our members.

Finally, you should be aware that our physical pagers, which are Motorola Minitor VI recently purchased in 2020, do not respond reliably. Here is an example of recent failures that we know about:

On the 3rd of July some of our members received a page- yet at least one of our pagers did not work at the Town hall right in downtown Draper just blocks from our FD tower.

On July 5, 2023, Draper Fire conducted 3 test pages with dispatch, all 3 were partial failures and one a complete failure:

- The first page was issued at approximately 12:13 and the pagers that were at the fire department alerted but not our cellphone apps. The Chief was having lunch at a popular establishment on County Hwy B between Winter and Hayward and did not receive the page on his pager or cellphone app.
- We gathered all the pagers outside the doors of the Draper FD and conducted a second test at approximately 15:06 that completely failed. No pagers or apps activated within 60 feet of our FD tower.
- We contacted dispatch 20 minutes later to verify the page failed and conducted a 3rd test at 15:29. This time all the pagers activated but none of the Alert911 apps.
- Draper Chief Tim Kelley spoke with John Kruk about the issues and he stated that the Draper tower is not transmitting, that our signal is still only coming from 3 distant towers such as Pipestone. This is after assurances since at least 2018 that fire radios and pagers would receive signal from the Draper tower after the new equipment was installed in 2019. That equipment was installed but apparently is not working or not working properly.

Please let us know what the status is on this tower (the Draper tower) and the Active 911 apps as soon as possible, and implement any other means of paging you may have such as texts or emails. The pagers and radios have not worked reliably in Draper for the past 20 years- this has negatively impacted response outcomes and retention of members on our department. It is the subject of numerous meeting minutes of the fire department and town board going back as far as 2002. We are actively building a municipal fire department and the 911 system is the number one priority for us- our town board passed a resolution Monday night to address the continuing problems with the county board. In addition to not receiving pages, there are many places the radios don't work- this is extremely concerning!

Thank you for your attention to this matter, we appreciate anything you can do to further support us and make sure we are getting our calls.

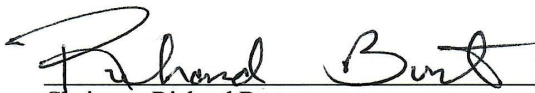

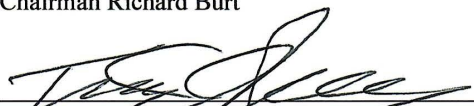
IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED THAT:

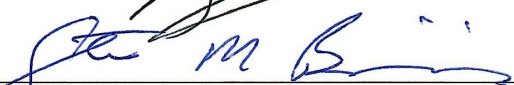
The Town of Draper Board requests assistance from the Sawyer County Board to provide the Town of Draper with working emergency services communication services, with weekly status updates provided until communication services are fully functional– after which a full documentation of deliverables consisting of 1) Root Cause Analysis (RCA) of the repeated failures, 2) The successful test results after repair, 3) The changes implemented to restore services, and 4) Future mitigation measures to be provided by the Sawyer County Communication Specialist to the Sawyer County Public Safety Committee, the Town of Draper Board, and the Town of Draper Municipal Fire Department.

Outage mitigation measures and restoration procedures must be implemented, documented, and provided by the Sawyer County Communication Specialist to the Sawyer County Public Safety Committee, the Town of Draper Board, and the Town of Draper Municipal Fire Department to ensure future communication system uptime availability of ~100% and restore confidence in Sawyer County Communication Services. Any future outages must be documented and reported to the Sawyer County Public Safety Committee and any impacted local municipal governments at monthly intervals.
