Call to Order – Chair Ron Buckholtz called the meeting to order at 9:00 am. Roll Call taken. Quorum was met.

Certification of Compliance with the open meeting law was met.

Circuit Court --

Judge's Report – Judge Yackel advised that branch 2 Judicial Assistant is back at work. He and Judge Isham have been meeting with the Recovery Court team. At the beginning of 2024, we should be operating full speed with both judicial seats.

Courthouse Remodel Update – Mr. Albarado advised that the HVAC is running better, the floor areas have been worked on but more is yet to be done.

Clerk of Court's Office Reports -

A written report was provided. The listing of type of new trial cases filed from October 24th through November 28th was included. Three jury trials are scheduled during the month of December. Ms. Kelsey advised that the financial clerk has been able to begin collection operations.

Sheriff's Department Report –

Communication Center Report – A written report was provided and reviewed. Lt. Ripczinski recognized the retirement of Lynette Poppe from dispatch. December 2nd there was an additional fatal car crash. Deflection training began today.

Patrol Report – A written report was provided. Lt. Woller. Average population and daily jail population remains lower than the past year. Two are currently on monitoring and one on Huber privileges.

Jail Report – A written report was provided. The current unemployment rate is 84% and the total population was at 62. There are currently 2 individuals on electronic monitoring and 1 working Huber privileges.

Communication Systems Specialist Report – A written report was provided.

Code Enforcement Specialist – A written report was provided and reviewed by Mr. Blicharz. The 2024 dog licensing process has opened.

Emergency Management --

A written report was provided and reviewed by Lt. Ripczinski. A Disaster Recovery training was hosted and had attendees from across the state.

Communication Center Report – A written report was provided and reviewed by Lt. Ripczinski; two new hires are in training. The DMA 2 PSAP grant in the amount of \$422,559.91 was received.

Child Support Department Report --

A written report was provided, listing 1,117 open cases. Total October current support due is \$130,851.15 and total support collected is \$95,275.50.

Emergency Services --

A written report was provided listing calls by township, call volume and other activities including a training update. A dementia training session with Sawyer County and LCO Dementia Care Specialist Joanie Zecherly and Alison Cuddy was a great success and will become a part of the new hire training going forward. The Hayward High School EMR class is getting close to the finish and all students are still in attendance.

Ambulance Report and Ambulance Billing – A written report was provided and is the same report that is presented at the Finance Committee.

Ambulance Service Agreement with Town of Bass Lake – Mr. Albarado advised that a \$60/head per capita rate was presented. A motion to approve the agreement was made by Mr. Peters; second by Mr. Buckholtz; an electronic vote was taken and passed 4-0.

Criminal Justice Coordinating Council Update -

Mr. Albarado provided a verbal update and recap of the last CJCC meeting.

Call to Order – Chair Ron Buckholtz called the meeting to order at 11:00 am. Roll Call taken. Quorum was met.

Certification of Compliance with the open meeting law was met.

Vehicle Take-Home Policy -

Mr. Albarado provided some background information on the topic and provided a copy of Statute 66.0502 *Employee residency requirements prohibited* policy, as well as the County current residency 25-mile radius requirement policy. The state statute limiting residency has been rescinded. Administration also talked with our insurance company to determine any potential impact of a policy change. Sheriff Mrotek provided historical background information and comparables. The purpose of the take-home squad started because staff was not staffed 24-hours at that time. Some counties do not have take-home squads and some just recently instituted a take-home squad policy. We have six deputies who live outside of our county at this time. To take vehicles home, there would be an IRS tax that affected officers would need to pay. A motion was made by Mr. Savitski to change the current policy to allow deputies to take the County squad home if they live within 25 miles of the county line; second by Mr. Peters and forward to the Administration Committee. A roll call vote was taken of the Public Safety Committee meeting and failed 2-3; “yes” votes from Weaver and Savitski; “no” votes from Buckholtz, Peters, and Helwig. This topic will go to the January Public Safety meeting.

- Patrol call volume decreased from last month's report for December' 23 to **602**, the three-month trend shows: Oct' 23 was 763, while Nov' 23 was 711. This month was also a decrease from Dec' 22, which was 913 calls for service.
- For Dec 2023, Sawyer County Deputies in this period have issued **30** Citations for traffic offenses, **1** written warning and **20** Non-Traffic Citations. Per Community Maps: there have been **13** Total Crashes, **2** with Personal Injury, and **1** Fatalities in our County for this time period.

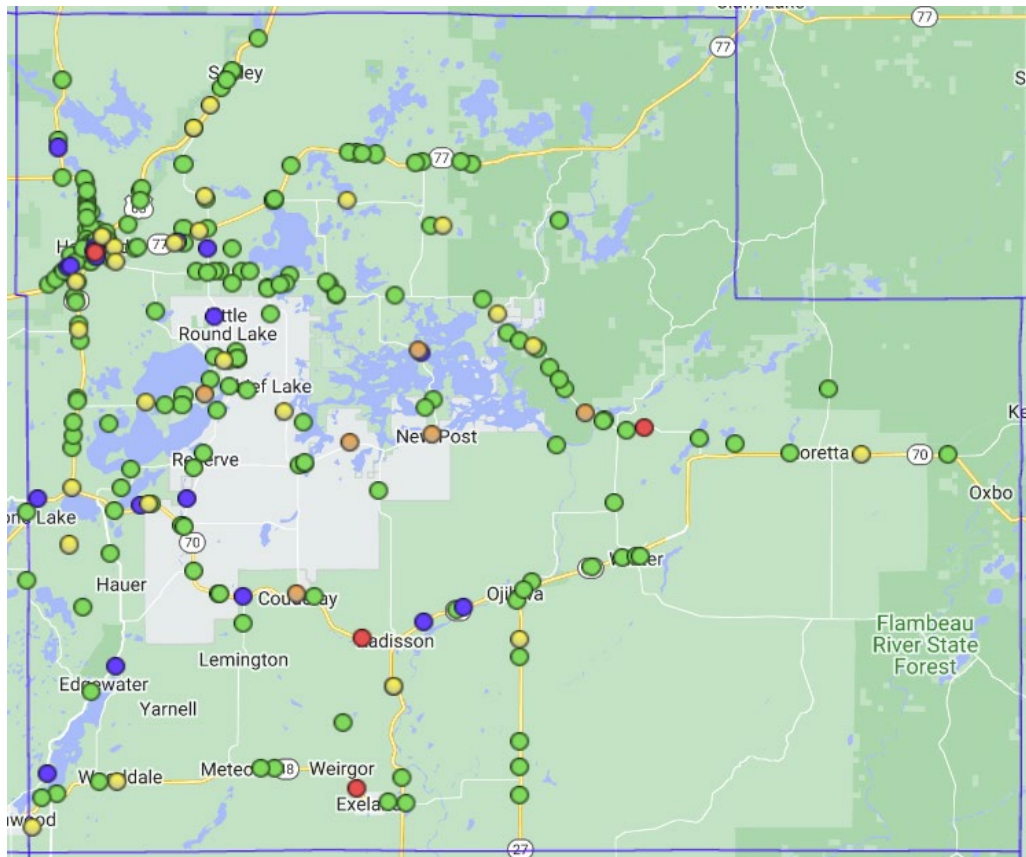

Animal Control

- The Kennel Attendant Position was filled last month – Ms. Chapman has been hard at work learning the ropes and has been doing a fantastic job. Training will continue into more as she progresses.

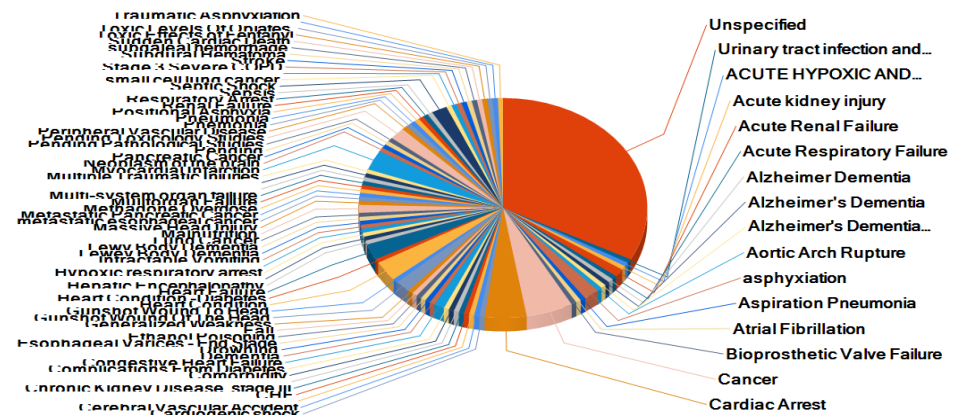
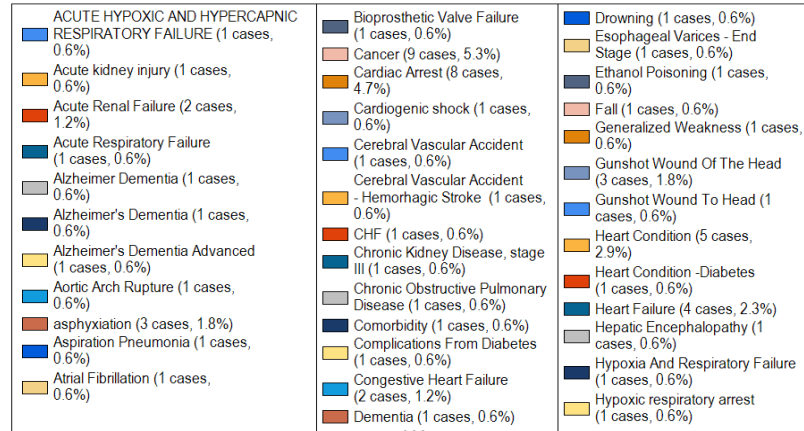

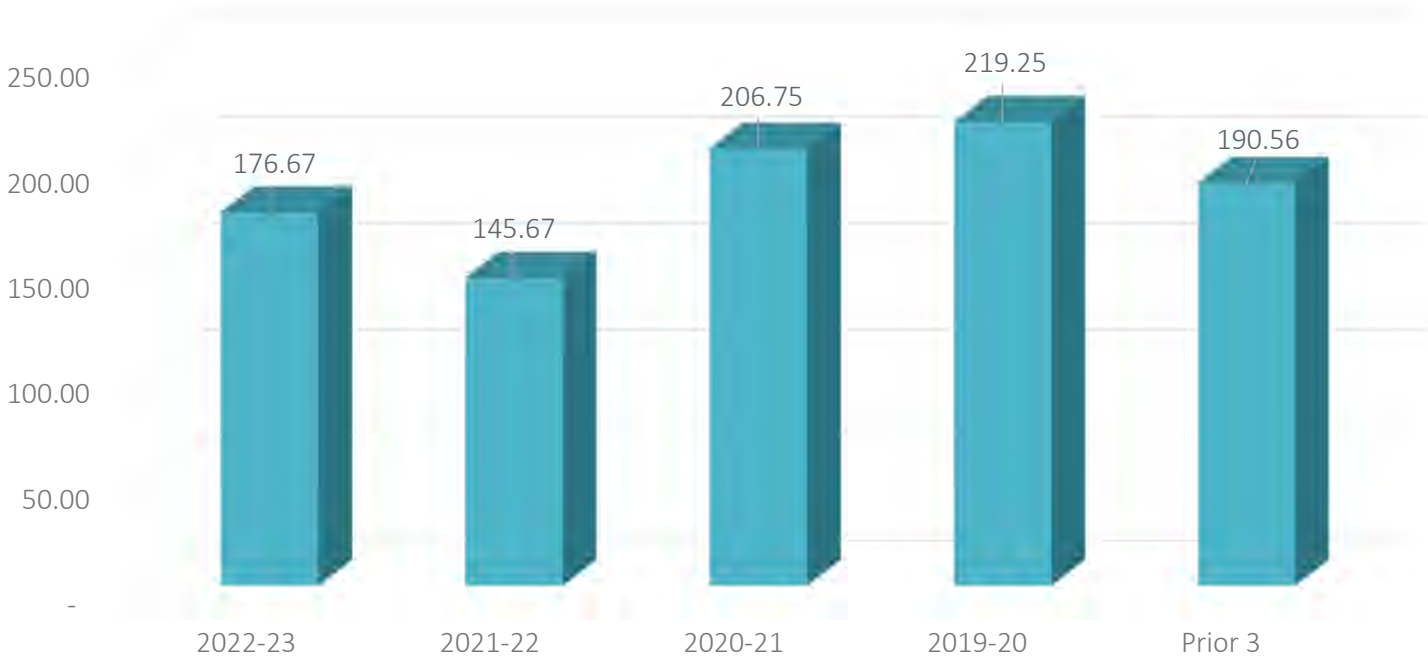

December-November



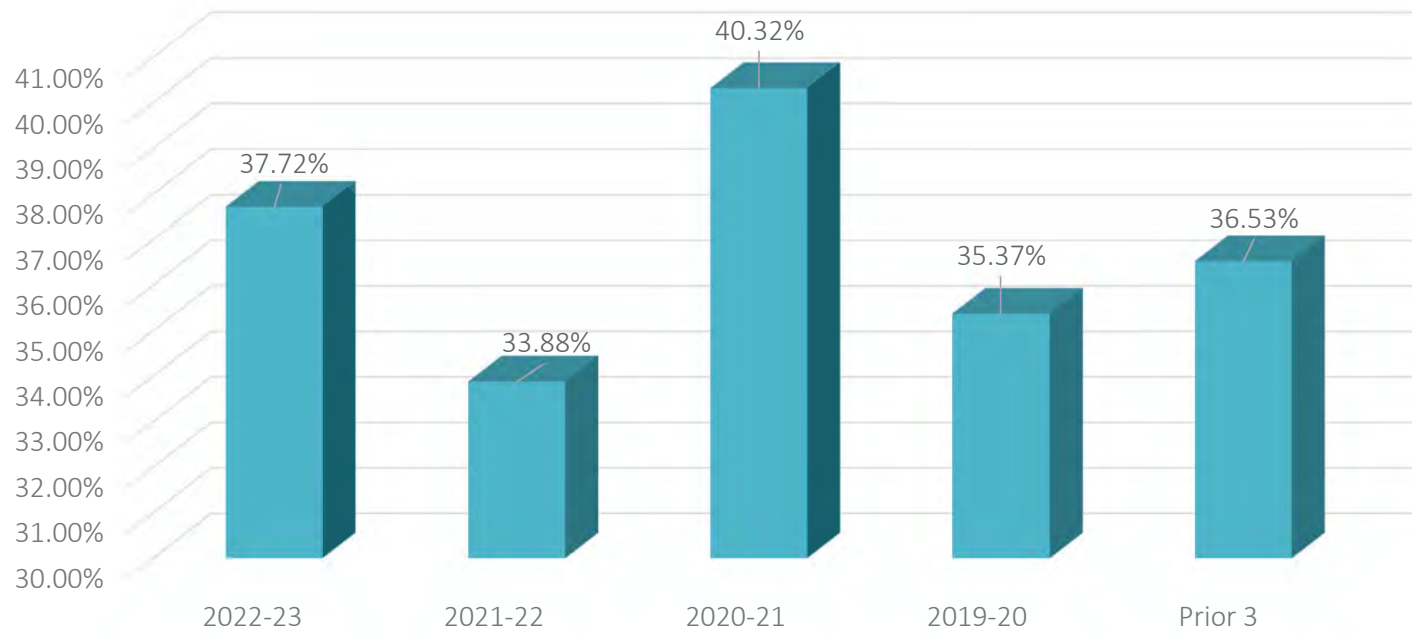
Average Billed per Month per Year
December-November

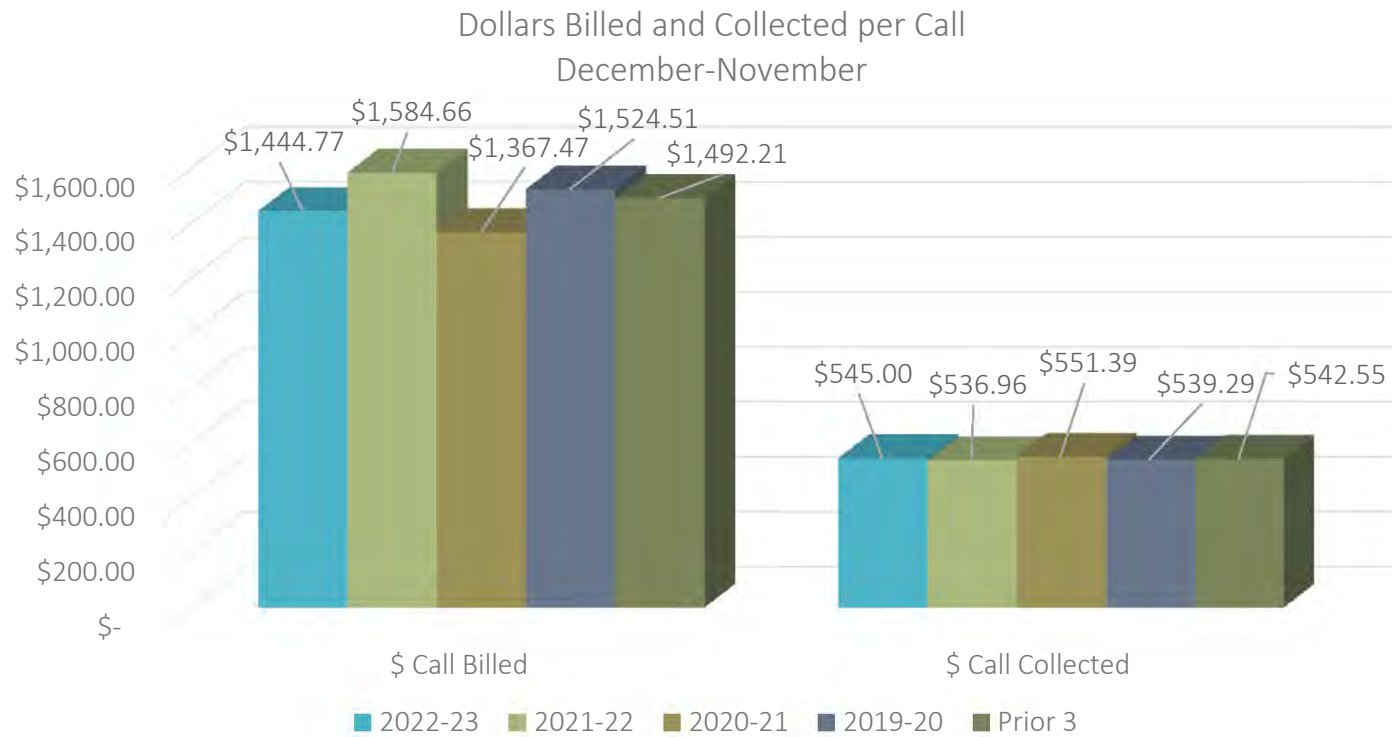


Average Collected per Month per Year
