Call to Order – Chair Ron Buckholtz called the meeting to order at 9:00 am. Roll Call taken. Quorum was met.

Certification of Compliance with the open meeting law was met.

Meeting Agenda

Public Comment –

Minutes from the previous meeting dated: January 4, 2024

Motion carried without negative vote.

Circuit Court --

Judge's Report – Judge Yackel reported that their first person was introduced into the drug court system. Yesterday's jury trial went smoothly.

Courthouse Remodel Update – Mr. Albarado reported that the floor has been completed; the last of the HVAC repairs have been done, and the AV systems upgrades have been completed.

Clerk of Court's Office Reports -

A written report was provided. There are six jury trials scheduled for February at this time; revenue collected through SDC and TRIP/DOR for the period 12/27/23-1/23/24 is \$9,225.82.

Sheriff's Department Report –

Patrol Report – A written report was provided and reviewed by Lt. Ripczinski. Total crashes from 2023 was 305, with 81 personal injuries and 5 fatalities. They are currently proceeding as if the Birkie will run as expected until they are notified of that changes in plans.

Jail Report – A written report was provided and reviewed by Chief Sajdera. We currently have 6 individuals on electronic monitoring and one on Huber.

Joint Power Agreements – Ms. Ripczinski has sent out the agreements for signatures for annual renewal. A motion was made by Mr. Peters; second by Mr. Savitski. Motion carried without negative vote.

Communication Systems Specialist Report – This contract has been switched to GenComm who has been working with the Sheriff's Department and the Fire Association, which held a meeting in Exeland.

Code Enforcement Specialist – A written report was provided. Brandon Blicharz is no longer in the position but a replacement will be sought. The Sheriff's office will help with animal intake in the meantime.

Ordinance Update – Animal Control – No update at this time.

Criminal Justice Coordinating Council – No update at this time.

Emergency Management --

Written reports were provided and reviewed. Two trainees have moved to regular part-time positions and applications have been received for the vacant overnight shifts. They have been working closely with the American Birkebeiner for planning, as well as many different agencies who partook in three different table-tops for preparedness. They have also been meeting with Townships during their monthly town board meetings for introductions; assisting them with Emergency Operations Plans as needed. Dispatch call volume is slightly down from last year.

Child Support Department Report --

A written report was provided. Total November support due was \$374,137.64 and collected was \$267,726.42.

Emergency Services --

Ambulance Report and Ambulance Billing – A written report was provided and reviewed by Mr. Froemel. Last year's calls averaged about 3 runs per day. They are considering moving the Stone Lake ambulance toward the Exeland area to increase potential coverage.

Medical Examiner Report – He provided a review of what we can expect in transfers with the closing of medical facilities in Eau Claire.

Out-of-County Vehicle Policy Update -

Mr. Albarado provided an update. The Finance Committee requested additional information on financial impact. The cost for hiring a new deputy appears to be \$16,185; additional cost for take-home costs is \$23,855.60 for the existing five deputies.

Meeting Date/Time – The next meeting of the Public Safety Committee will be Thursday, March 7th at 9:00 am in the Board Room.

Meeting adjourned at 9:37 am.

Patrol Total CAD Calls Report- Attached.

- Patrol call volume increased from last month's report for February'24 to **827**, the three-month trend shows: Dec' 23 was 602, while Jan' 24 was 555. This month was also an increase from Feb '23, which was 633 calls for service. The increase is mainly accounted for by Traffic Stops, Assist Citizens and Civil Process.
- For Feb 2024, Sawyer County Deputies in this period have issued **38** Citations for traffic offenses, **5** written warning and **14** Non-Traffic Citations. Per Community Maps: there have been **17** Total Crashes, **1** with Personal Injury, and **0** Fatalities in our County for this time period.

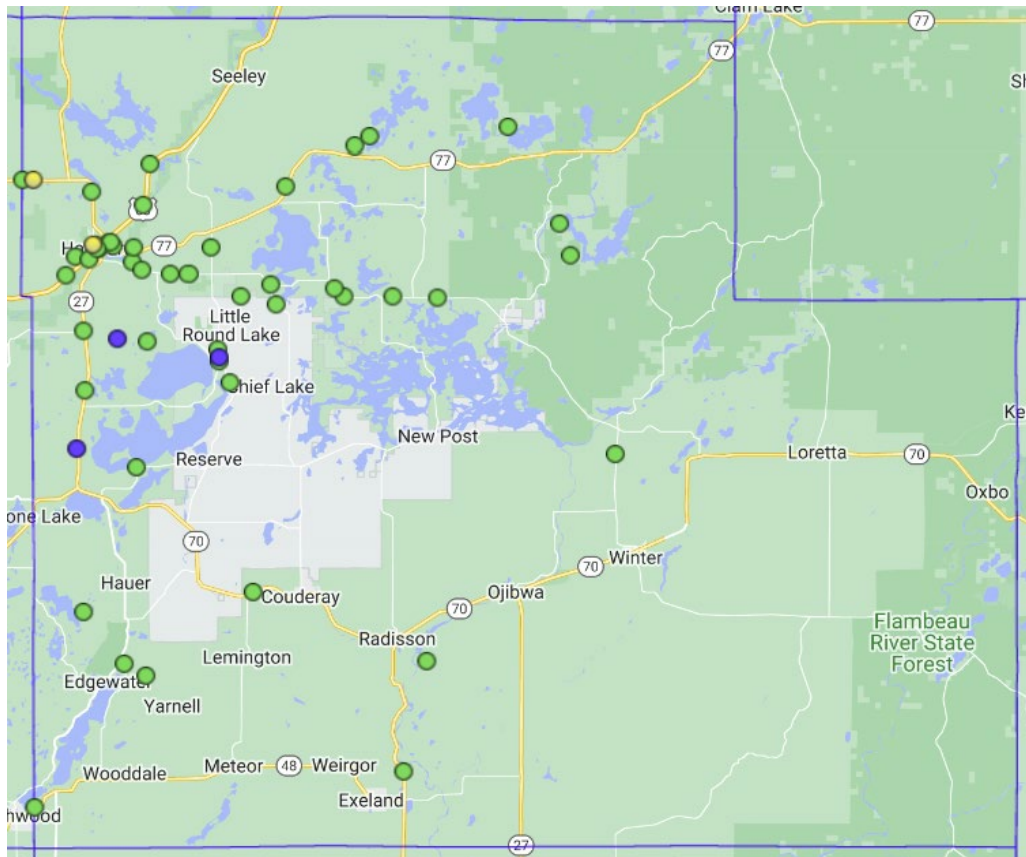

RE: Radio System Assessment

I reviewed your existing radio system and below are my findings and some recommendations.

Concerns:

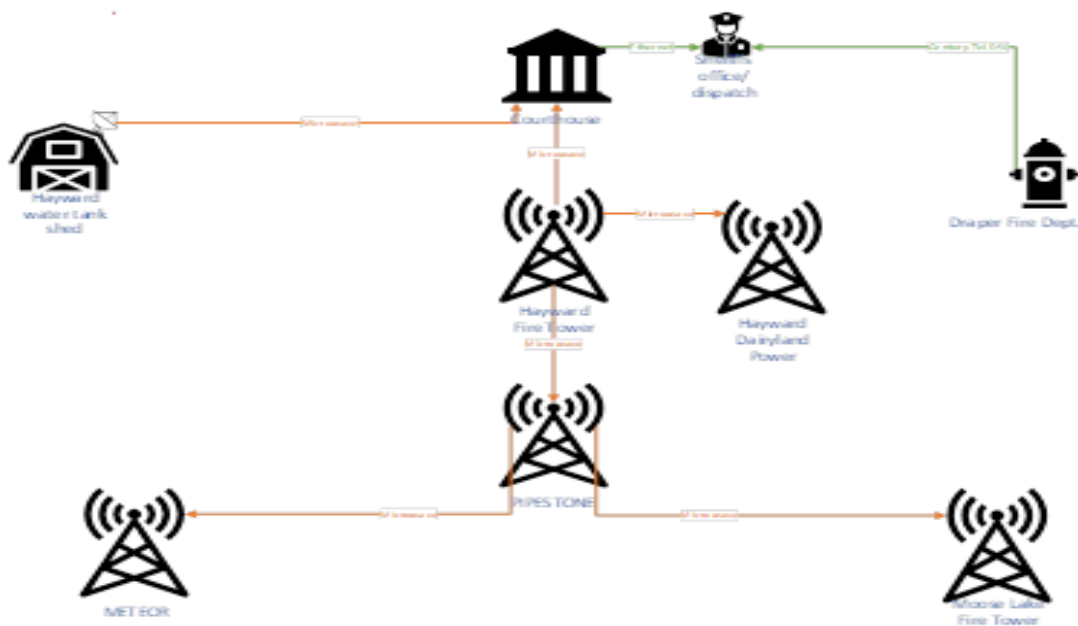
The following concerns were identified:

1. Poor coverage on both the P25 law channel and analog paging channel county wide.
2. Poor confidence in the system from users.

Current System:

The current system is a 6-site conventional simulcast system using one channel of P25 known as LAWD and one channel of analog known as SWPAGE.

Assessment Results by Site:

Hayward Dairy Land Power

- RX and TX antenna sweeps showed positive results and are in good order.
- Selex equipment in use was tested and is within industry spec.
- Three of the Selex boxes at the site are not on or used.
- AC power for equipment needing it in the rack is provided by non-standard power strips.
- There is no UPS, and no battery backup for the equipment.
- No connections are labeled.

Hayward Water Tank

- Antenna sweep indicates a bad antenna/coax.
- Selex equipment at the site is one base for LAW-D and is working with in industry spec.
- Transmit is disabled at this site, assuming due to bad antenna.
- AC power to the equipment is non-commercial power strip.
- Microwave is mounted to stainless pole on back of shed, this mounting option causes quite a bit of movement in moderate wind conditions.
- Insulation glued to door has fallen off.
- No connections are labeled.
- No fencing around site for security.

Draper Fire Dept.

- RX and TX antenna sweeps were positive results and are in good order.
- Selex equipment in use was tested and is within industry spec.
- SWLAWD was powered on, but both transmit and receive were disabled in the software.
- This being disabled may be due to ongoing network issues on the DSL line.
- SWFIRE and SWCOM bases are powered off and parts have been scavenged.
- SWPAGE has receive turned off and this is a transmit only site.
- The tower behind the station is rather short and this allows for fair coverage within Draper, however traveling just a few miles out of town and this coverage drops significantly.
- AC power to racked equipment is provided by a household type power strip plugged into an extension cord.
- No lightning arrestors.



- No UPS, battery backup or generator.
- Century Tel DSL is the main cause of network issues to this site, is not a reliable service for critical infrastructure.
- No connections are labeled.

Moose Lake Fire Tower

- RX and TX antenna sweeps showed positive results and are in good order.
- Selex equipment in use was tested and is within industry spec.
- SWFIRE and SWCOM bases are offline.
- SWPAGE has receive turned off and the receiver is not connected into the combining equipment. TX only
- AC power to racked equipment is provided from industry standard PDU.
- There is no UPS, battery backup or generator.
- No Connections are labeled.

Pipestone

- RX and TX antenna sweeps showed positive results and are in good order.
- Selex equipment in use was tested and is within industry spec.
- SWFIRE and SWCOM bases are offline.
- AC power to racked equipment is provided from industry standard PDU.
- No UPS or battery backup.
- There is a Generator, and it appears to be tested frequently.
- This site houses the counties WISCOM equipment, this equipment was tested by technicians from the state, they found three of the five repeaters had issues, two were pulled and sent for repair, the third will be pulled and sent in when the first two are returned.
- No connections are labeled.
- No fencing around site for security.

Meteor

- RX and TX antenna sweeps showed positive results and are in good order.
- Selex equipment in use was tested and is within industry spec.
- SWFIRE and SWCOM bases are offline.
- AC power to racked equipment is provided from industry standard PDU.
- There is no UPS, battery backup or generator.
- No connections are labeled.



- The shelter itself is rather unkempt and dirty.
- Shelter is not level.
- There is no cable management on the tower, some feed lines are barely connected to the tower and are rubbing and banging into the tower.

Summary

In conclusion, the equipment is working, there are items that need to be addressed immediately (hayward water tank antenna and microwave dish), (Meteor cable management). The analysis shows that locations are the root cause of the poor coverage within the county. Some maps were provided for the county in August of 2023. They indicated that new locations needed to be selected to provide reliable county wide coverage. While the Selex equipment is in working order, it is not the recommended equipment to use for your simulcast requirements. The Selex equipment is not capable of linear simulcast, which based on mapping and analysis is the preferred modulation to be used in Sawyer County. The lack of batteries, and generators as backups at these sites is also a cause for concern. If we look to last year's winter and the power outages experienced not only by Sawyer County but most counties in northern Wisconsin, currently if that happens again, the radio coverage will be severely reduced, as I'm sure many of the users would attest.

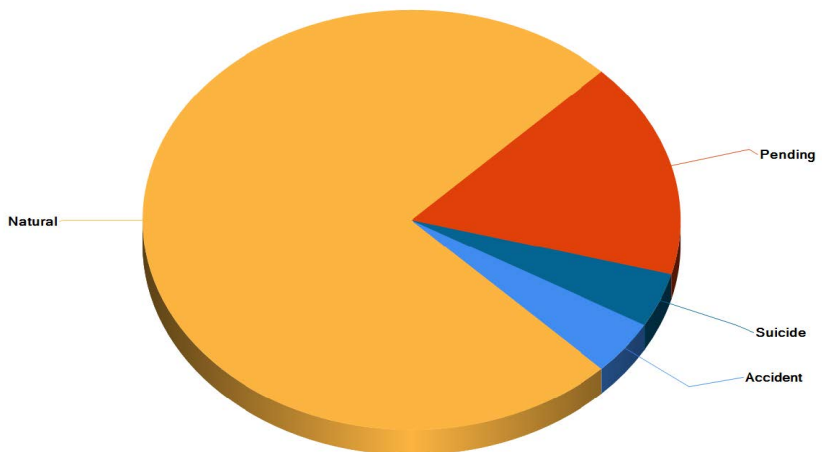

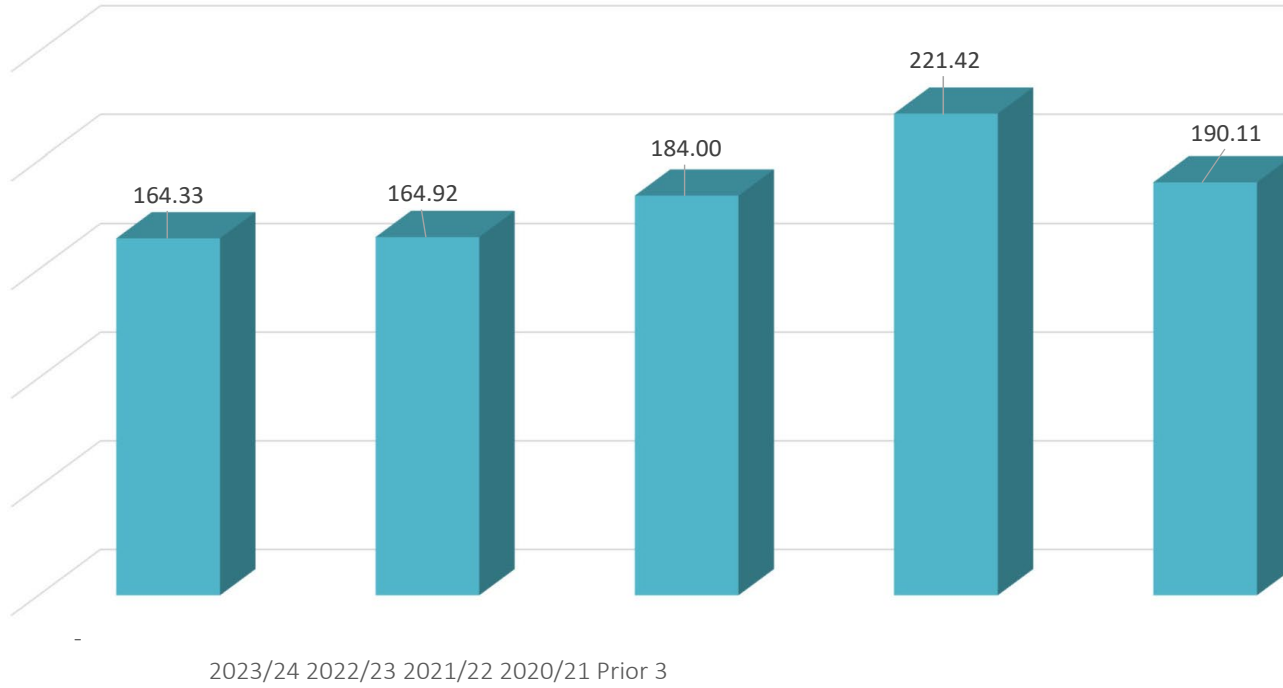

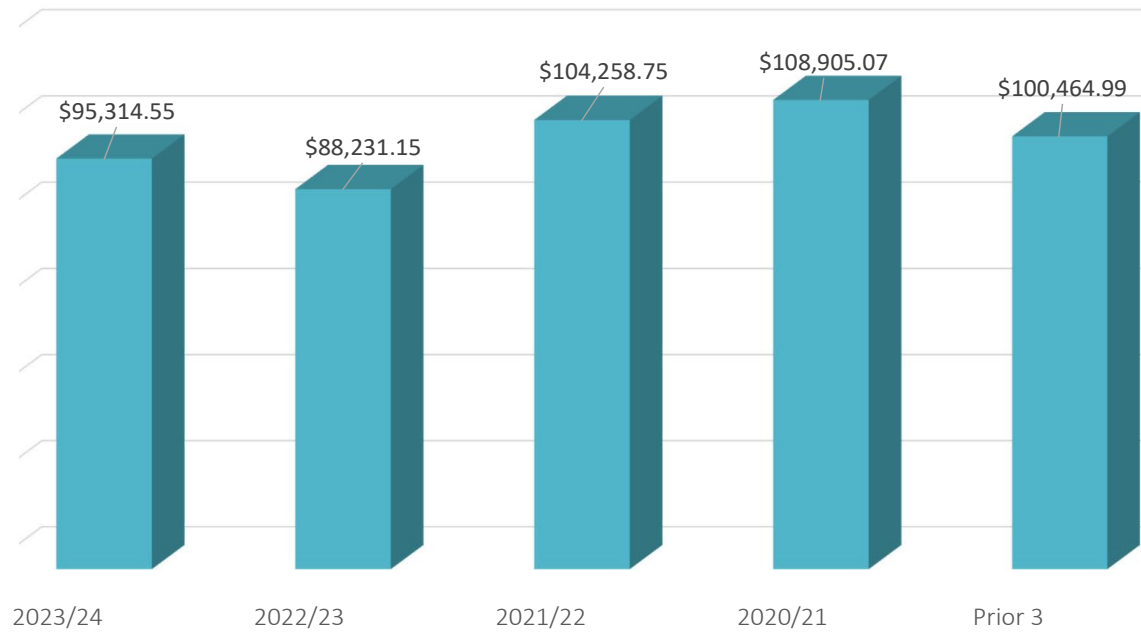
Average Calls per Month per
Year February-January



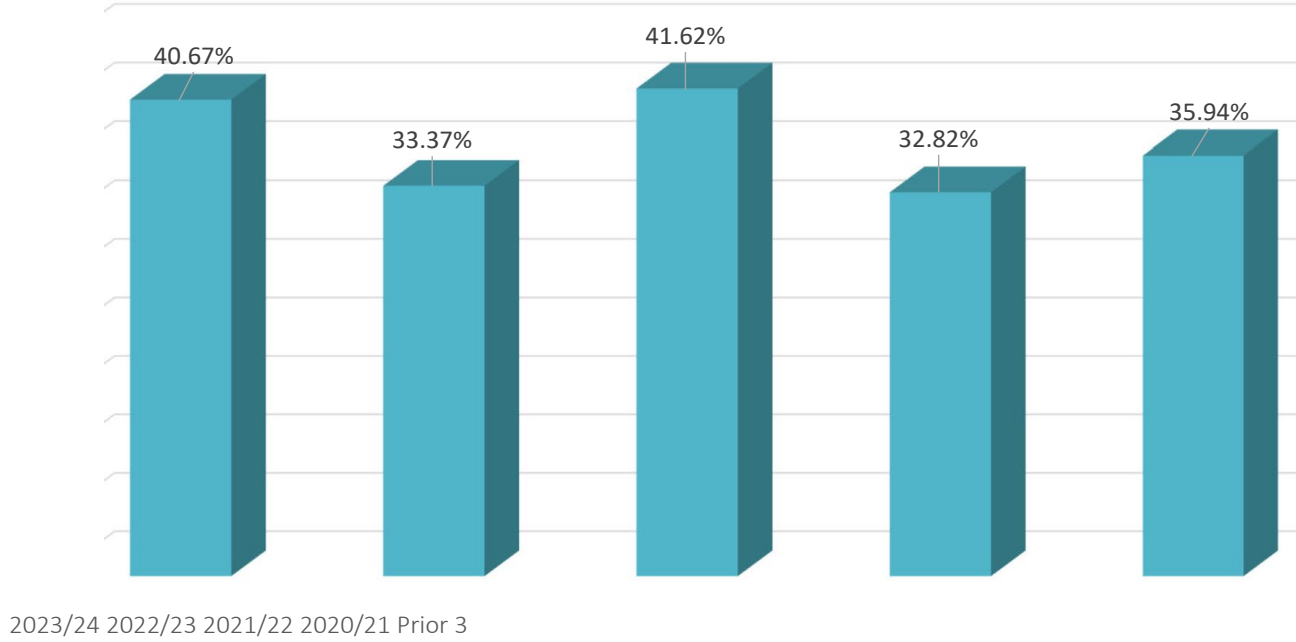
