Lt. Woller provided a verbal updated of inmate population statistics. A list of inmate programs that are available in the jail was provided. Northwood Tech College is offering an 8-week blueprint reading course along with GED/HSED programming. There have been 21 successful GED completions in the '23/'24 school year. Auralea Carrell has done an exceptional job getting students through completion.

Criminal Justice Coordinator -

A written report was included in the packet showed current statistics. They submitted a grant application for building bridges two weeks ago.

Diversion and Recovery Court Report -

CJCC Memorandum of Understanding with LCO -

Mr. Albarado reported that the MOU with the tribe that expired this spring has not made progress in communication. We will need to decide how to handle the funding, should that not move forward. Ms. Isham provided an update from the tribe, and hopes it will move forward.

Health & Human Services Report -

Ms. Lyons reported that they have been focusing on getting the emergency sheltering exercise running. They are looking at focusing on vaping.

Youth Justice Update

Youth Justice Update – Ms. Inczauskis provided a verbal update. They were approved for the state funded youth innovation grant for \$100,000 to start implementing the youth diversion program. The main focus will be truancy. They will also work on the drug/alcohol problems.
